

Freemans mark Anniversary

Over 200 people came out for an open house at Trinity United Church Sunday in honor of Frank and Lucinda Freeman's 50th wedding anniversary.

The RR 3 Acton couple were married October 14, 1933, at the then Churchill United Church. It is now Churchill Community Church.

The newlyweds immediately began building their home on Lot 6, on the Fifth Line of Erin Township, where they still live, farming the land. It was only this past summer that Mr. Freeman sold the last of the cattle and is now settling into retirement.

For many years Mr. Freeman served on the school board and has also been a United Church elder for 34 continual years. He was a clerk of session at Churchill Church and then when the couple moved their place of worship to Trinity United in Acton in 1969, Mr. Freeman became an elder there also.

The couple also belonged to the Farm Vacation Association for 14 years, having opened their home to tourists for many years.

The couple have one son, Ted, who has a farm mechanization business at RR 3 Rockwood. He is married to Shirley, and has two sons Lyle, 21 and Gordon 19.

Sunday's celebrations were put on by Ted and Shirley. About 50 friends and relatives enjoyed a dinner in the evening.

Public Meeting

There will be a public meeting tonight (Wednesday) to discuss Halton's Energy From Waste program plans at the Regional Administration Building on Bronte Rd., Oakville at 7.30 p.m.

"Through the development of an EFW Disposal System, it is the intention of Halton Region to reduce the amount of landfill capacity required within the region," said Vicky Gibson, projects officer for the program.

It is the region's hope to find potential customers for the energy produced by incinerating waste at an EFW plant, and doing a marketing survey to scout for business will be the first phase of the program.

According to Chief Administrative Officer, Dennis Perlin, the region is hoping to dispose of up to 75 per cent of its solid waste with an EFW system. Another 20 per cent would be landfilled and five per cent recycled.

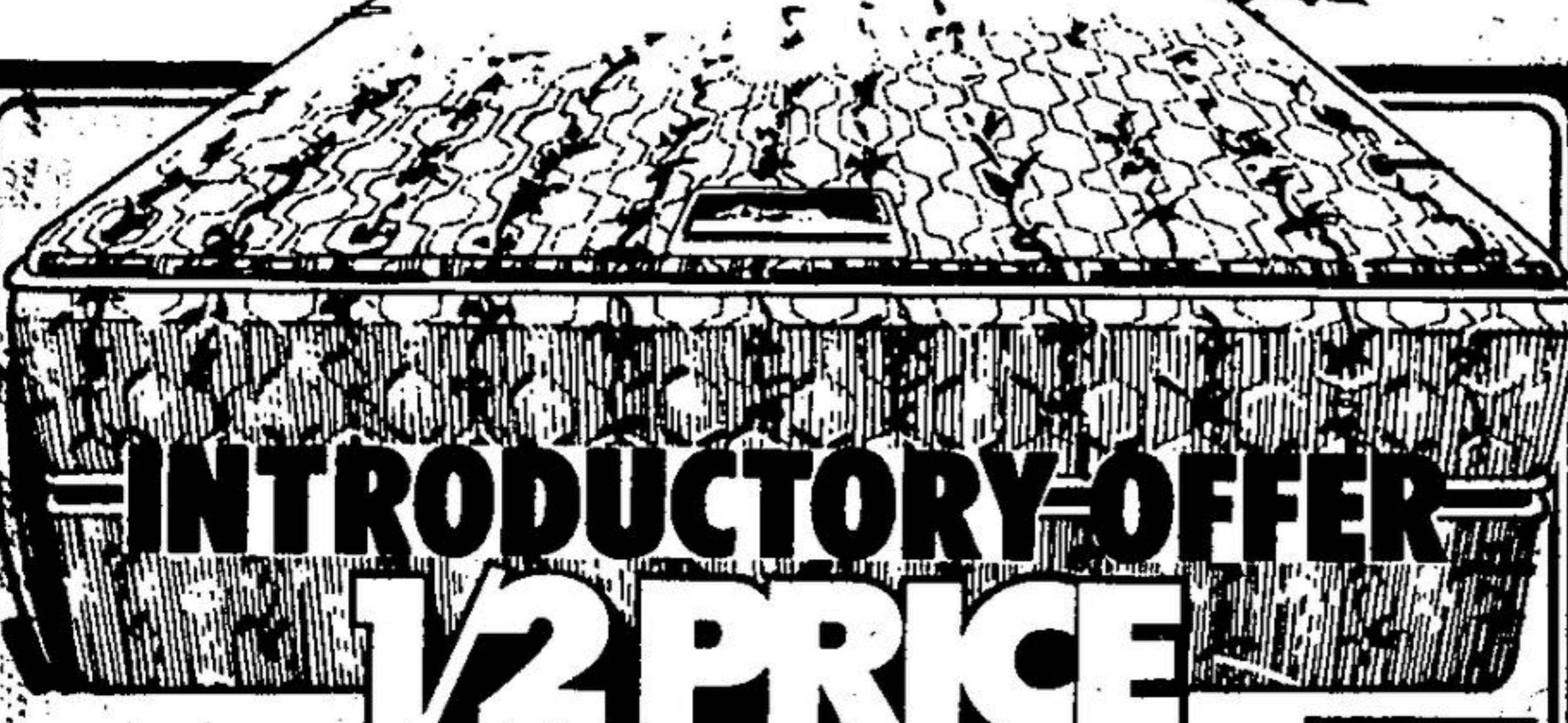

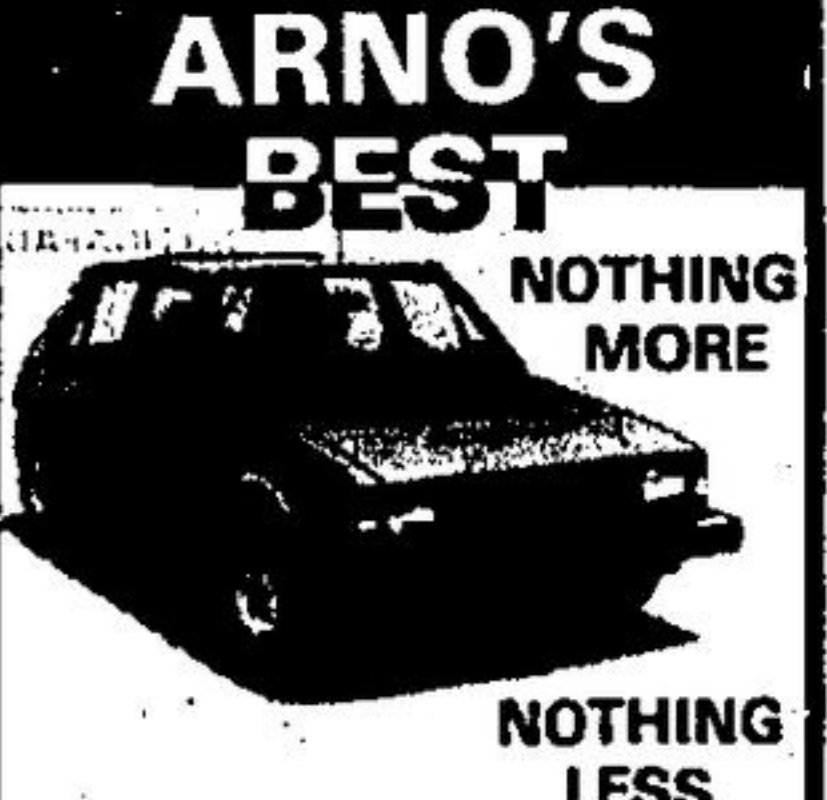
