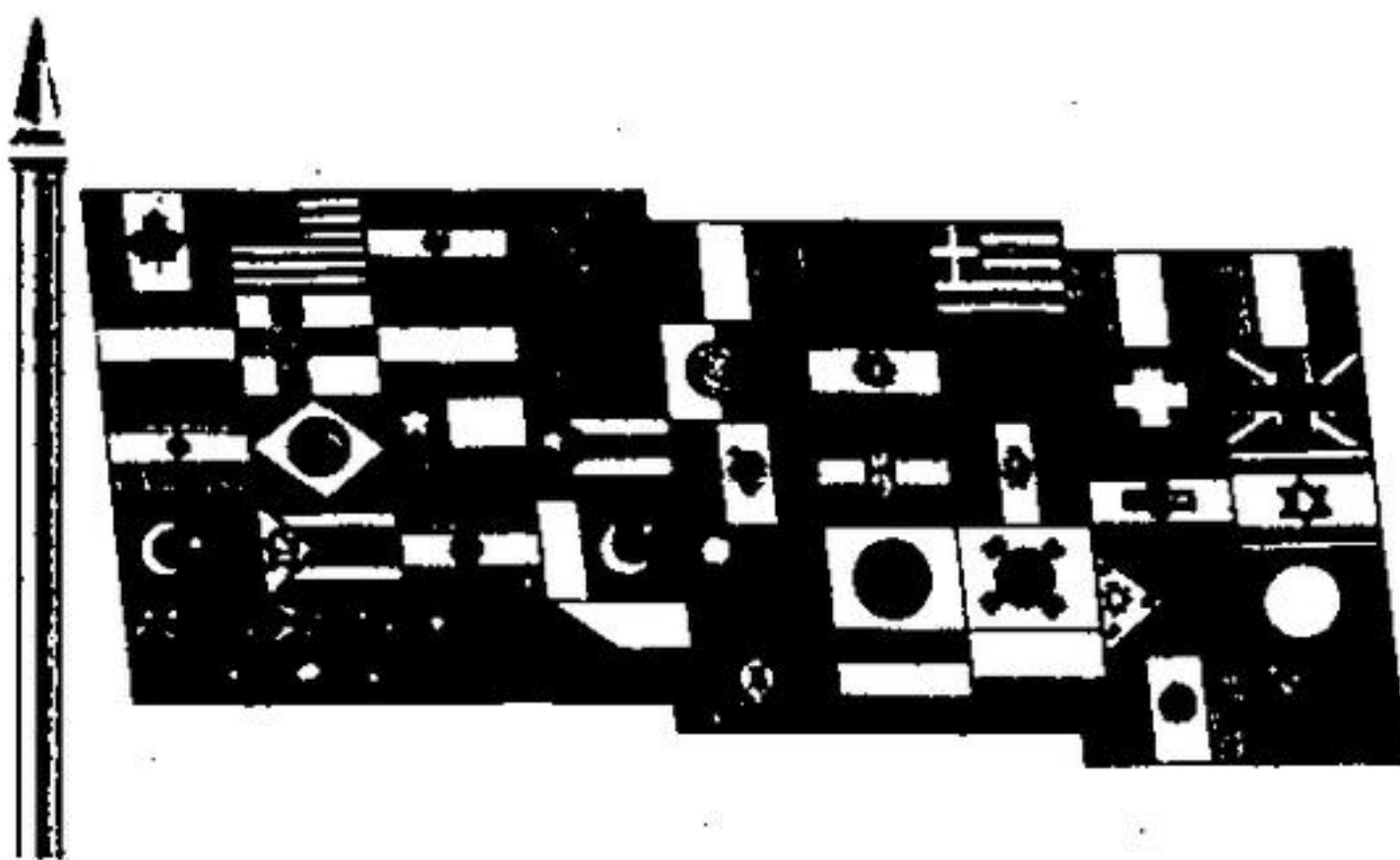
Public Meeting

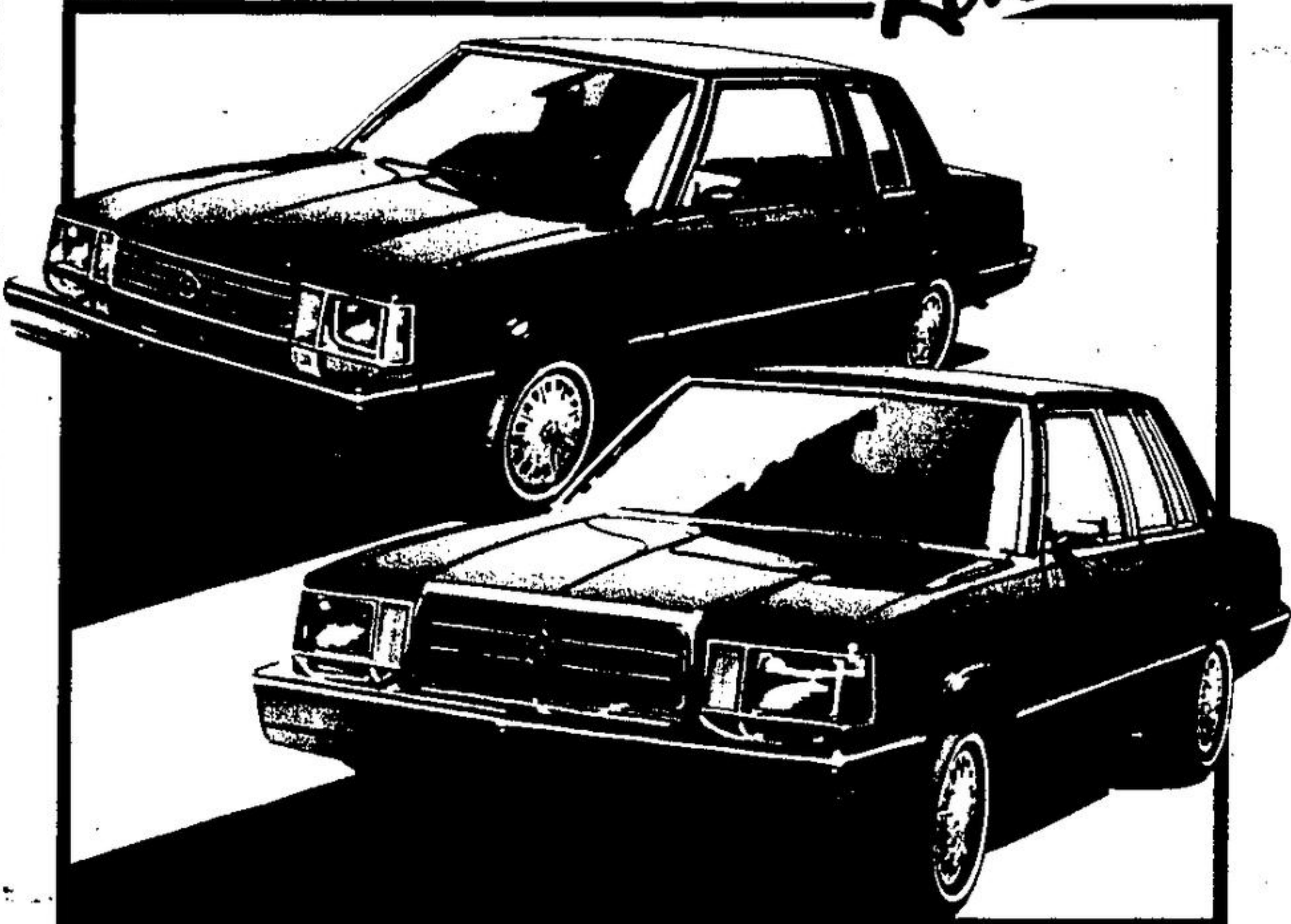

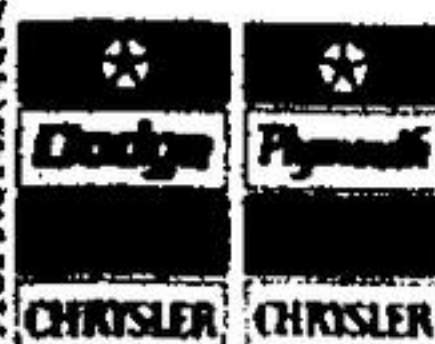
