Easy Cheesecake

Sprinkle bottom of 8x8 cake tin with graham cracker crumbs.

FILLING

12 oz. cream cheese	1/2 cup white sugar
2 egg yolks	Pinch salt
	1/2 tsp. vanilla

Beat until creamy. Add 4 egg whites, beaten stiff, to cheese mixture and blend well. Pour into prepared pan and bake 1/2 hour at 350 degrees. Remove from oven and quickly add:

TOPPING

1/2 pint sour cream, 3 tbsp. sugar and 1/2 tsp. vanilla mixed slightly, and return to oven for 8 minutes more. Cool and then chill for several hours in fridge.

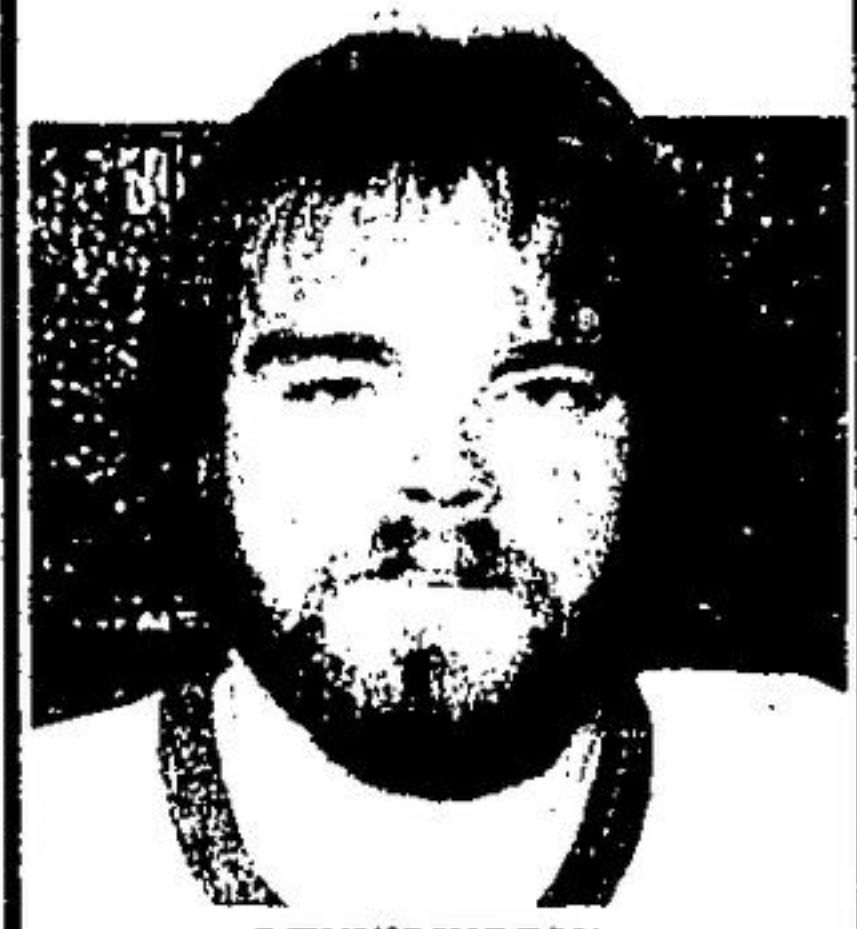

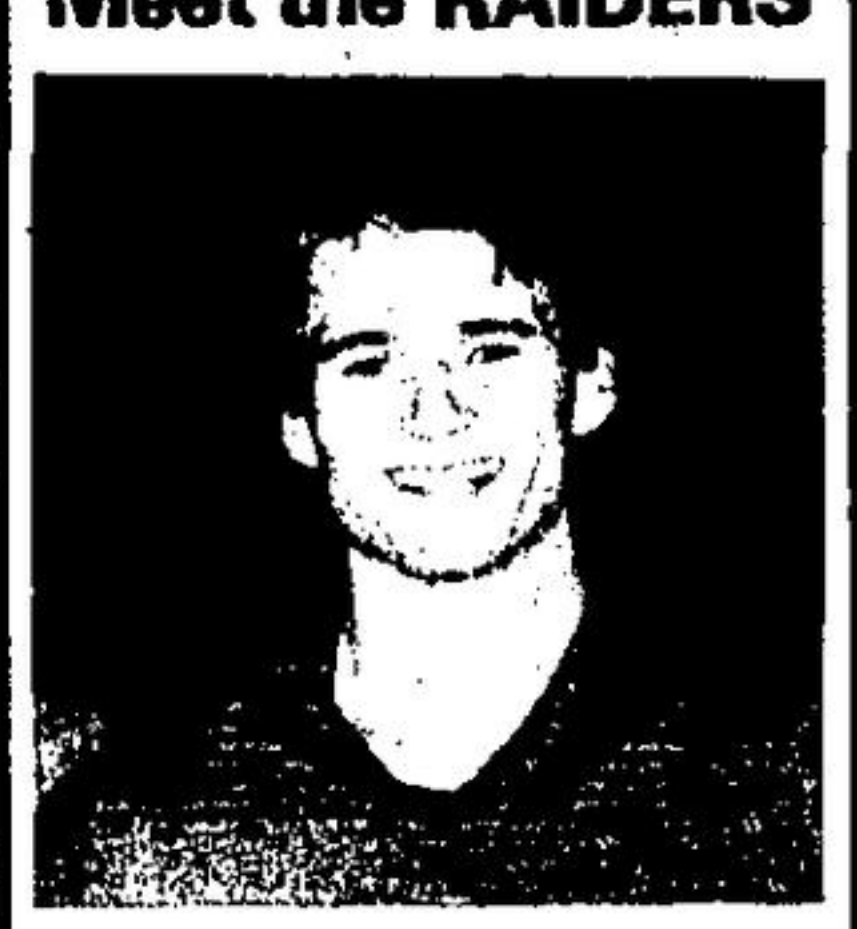


DENNIS KIRTON
