

# Buck stops there but still no mayor

When disaster strikes, it will be the mayors who will have the ultimate responsibility for the final decisions. But not one mayor attended the day-long emergency planning seminar at regional headquarters on a recent Friday afternoon. Halton police chief James Harding, deputy fire chief Ed Guest, representatives from the ambulance services, volunteer services, provincial and federal governments, chemical safety organizations and conservation authorities were all there. But no mayors. In fact, only two regional councillors (Oakville's Jackie Cutmore and Milton councillor Bill Johnson) and four Halton Hills councillors were present at the disaster planning seminars. Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett was tied up in the morning with the dome presentation to the province. "In many respects, we have the wrong people here," said Ken Reeves, co-ordinator of emergency planning for the province.

"The people who are here are already converted to the importance of emergency planning. The people we should have here are the senior elected representatives" he said. "Sometimes I think the only way we are going to get them interested is to have another Mississauga disaster." Approximately 65 people attended the seminars but Joanne Brown, administrative assistant to the region's CAO, said that number would almost have been doubled if all the town councillors had been present.

**PEST CONTROL**  
Systematic house cleaning cuts down on pest problems. Wipe and sweep up food from corners and cracks, behind drawers, along baseboards and around water pipes (especially under the kitchen sink). Scrub surfaces before treating with pesticides. Newly-treated surfaces should not be scrubbed.

**QUICK BURN**  
Hot water burns can occur quickly. It takes only six seconds for water at 60 degrees Celsius (140 degrees Fahrenheit) to produce a third degree burn. Water at 54 degrees Celsius (139 degrees Fahrenheit) can cause a third degree burn in 30 seconds.

**TUB SCALDS**  
Never leave a young child, who can turn the hot water tap on, alone in the bathtub. A serious burn could result.
