## Fr. Hayes opens mission

Father Jeremiah Hayes of the Redemptorist Order will conduct the Mission (Renewal) at St. Joseph's parish Sunday, November 27 until December 3.

Parish missions have been falling off, have they not? he was asked in an interview.

"Yes, the causes for this are not one, but many," replied Father Hayes. "One factor is that our people have become so mobile today, that the seasons when we can have such 'spiritual drives' in our parishes have diminished. So have the missionaries.

"Thirty years ago, parish missions were held annually in most parishes. In the past ten years, the Church was so busy with liturgical reforms, older methods were set aside. Now the assessment is that liturgical reform and the short Sunday homily are sadly insufficient. From the people themselves I hear a plea, 'Give us more opportunities to hear the Word of God and get a deeper grasp of Him.

"There have been waves of rebellion against authority, in universities, against established governments, rebellion against authority in the Church, and rebellion against authority in the home. Out of this come 'drop outs' from family life, from religion, from the human race even. But without goals, without God there has come a great wave of helplessness and hopelessness.

"This is what the Renewal Mission aims at, to open the Good Book and zero in on the values that have been put aside; the basic teachings of Christ that have been revealed have been obscured and forgotten," Father Hayes said.

## Beardmore settlement Clarification

Beardmore workers received either a \$1 or a \$1.03 an hour raise over two years when they accepted a new contract recently depending on if you include job classification rate hikes as part of the main wage increase or not.

Both Ed Parent, president of the union at the tannery, and Beardmore parent company, Canada Packers, spokesman Murray Stewart last week made announcements regarding the contract settlement.

Parent said the deal called for a \$1 an hour hike over two years, 50 cents a year.

Stewart announced the increase was \$1.03 over two years. He later explained the company was including the monetary increases contained in the changes to job classifications package in the overall increase. This worked out to an average hike of three cents an hour. However, he added, Parent was technically quite correct to say the pay boost is \$1 an hour over two years.

Parent noted 154 workers received increases based on pay adjustments for different job classifications ranging from two cents to \$1.75 an hour. The 10 to 11 cents an hour increase for job classification pay hikes mentioned in the story was just an example.

Stewart said the company was combining the across the board pay boost and increases for job classifications "to simplify it, to make it understandable." He added the increases amount to 6.4 per cent in the first year and 5.6 per cent in the second.

## No problems with overnight parking

Allowing overnight parking on Greenore Cres. and part of Kingham Rd. hasn't caused any problems for emergency vehicles.

Councillor Dave Whiting announced a report from Bylaw Enforcement Officer Jack Lusty indicated both the fire department and police have had no problems with the overnight parking on the streets this past

spring, summer and fall.

Overnight parking was approved from April 1 to November 30 earlier this year by council. Council is to review its lifting of the three hour overnight parking limit on specific streets in Acton early next year. Whiting said in light of the fact emergency vehicles have had no problems with the new parking situation, the review may not be necessary.
