Sabres look good losing to Streetsville

Although playing some of the best hockey the Sabres have played this season, the local team couldn't capitalize on several scoring opportunities to beat the Streetsville Derbys.

The Derbys, who are the top ranking team in the league so far this year, are a fast skating, well disciplined club and they proved it Saturday night against Acton, winning 7-3.

The first five and a half minutes of the first period remained scoreless as the Derbys controlled the puck. Then, suddenly, at 6:37, 11:08 and 12:16 the Derbys blasted in three quick goals leaving a stunned Sabres well behind.

Although at first a little disheartened, the Sabres came back playing a strong defensive style of hockey. Capitalizing on their opposition's mistakes seemed to be the Sabres plan as they rallied at 13:13 with a goal from Paul Fraser.

Assisted by Paul Cargill, Fraser put some distance between himself and the Derbys' defense and, picking his corner, he set the Acton squad back on track.

Moments later Fraser was harassing the Streetsville defense again and with an assist from Stan Smith, he snapped a shot over the Derbys' goaltender and the Sabres were back in the game.

Coming into the second period the Sabres were down one goal as the Derbys still continued to dominate the Sabres with hard skating and puck control.

However, the Sabres, still playing defensively, tied up the game after Cargill intercepted a Derbys' pass and left the puck for Fraser who counted his third goal of the evening.

From that point on, however, the game started to get rather chippy. Fights broke out and over 30 minutes of penalties were served by both teams.

The Sabres also made the mistake of trying to skate with the Derbys and it proved fatal. As soon as the local squad opened up

the Streetsville team pounced, scoring four more goals.

"I think the boys played a great game of hockey out there tonight," said coach Gary Hudson. "They followed the game plan, they didn't give up, they showed a lot of spunk out there and that's what I like to see."

"We still have the problem of a decided lack of talent as compared with the bigger centres like Streetsville and Burlington," remarked Hudson, "but we're working on getting some new talent into our club in the near future."

"As for last night in Milton," continued Hudson, "the boys played a fair game of hockey, but our goalie Fred Fess was having a terrible night. He couldn't seem to stop anything."

The Sabres travelled to Milton Friday night and the Steamers had a field-day downing the hapless Acton squad 15-4.

The Sabres started out on the right foot with a goal at 3:36 in the first period. Randy Coverdale, assisted Clint Watts and Ken Cavanagh, got the jump on the Steamers.

However, the Sabres lead was shortlived as the Milton squad retaliated with five goals in the remainder of the first period.

During the first half of the second period the Steamers were held back for a few moments, and then the rampage was on again, as Milton scored four more times.

The only relief for the Sabres came late in the second period when Dennis Kirton, assisted by Rick Elirins edged the Sabres up a little further on the scoreboard.

The third period proved even more disastrous for the Sabres as the Steamers tallied another six goals.

However, the Sabres did manage to save a little face as Rick Dodds, assisted by Kirton, and Brian Demone, assisted by Vince Paradiso and Clint Watts fired another two Sabres markers.

The Sabres next home game will be against Thornhill Friday. Saturday Acton travels to Georgetown.
