Oatmeal Molasses Cookies

A Great Lunchbox Cookie

|--------------------|--------------------------|
| 1 1/2 c. flour | 1/2 c. molasses |
| 1 tsp. soda | 1 tsp. vinegar |
| 2 tsp. cinnamon | 1/2 c. milk |
| 1/2 tsp. cloves | 2 eggs |
| 1/2 c. shortening | 2 c. rolled oats |
| 1/2 c. brown sugar | 1 c. raisins or currants |

Cream shortening. Add sugar. Add eggs, molasses. Sour the milk with the vinegar. Alternate dry ingredients with milk. Bake in 375° oven 12-15 minutes.

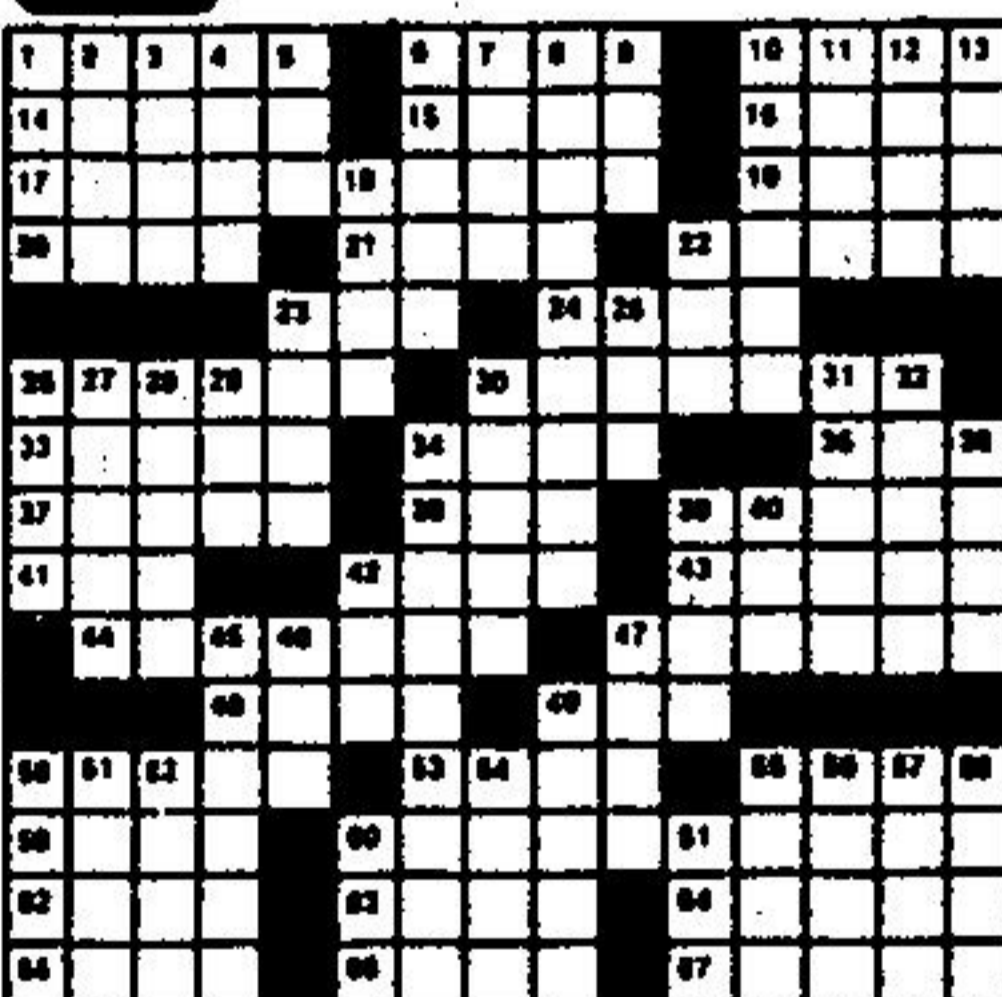

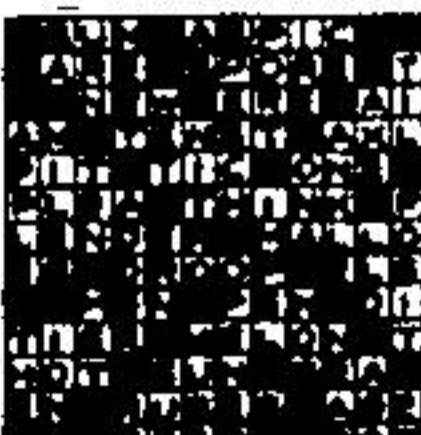
