Johnson to speak out

Milton Councillor Bill Johnson vowed Wednesday to go public with information on employee working conditions at Halton Centennial Manor that will shock people.

He made that statement just as council voted to release a formerly confidential report on absenteeism of Halton's employees which shows that in 1982 Manor service and maintenance workers were off the job an average of 18.5 days in paid sick leave. The average for other regional employees was 6.2 days in 1982.

The report from D.M. Camm, the region's Director of Personnel and Labour Relations said, "The amount of absenteeism and related loss of productivity at Halton Centennial Manor is very serious," and ongoing monitoring efforts should be pursued "vigorously."

Rates revised

Council approved a revised Water and Sewer Budget that will see rates in Halton Hills rise by 3.7 per cent in 1984.

It was reported last week that local residents could expect to pay \$220 next year for these services, but the revision will put the average residential bill at \$223.

Sewage plant upgraded

The Georgetown Water Pollution Control Plant will have over \$1-million spent to improve operations in 1984.

According to a report to council from Director of Public Works, Bob Moore, the facilities are structurally poor and "unsafe for the operations staff and general public."

Over \$100,000 will be spent at the Acton plant to improve operations and sampling though the plant is operating within Ministry of the Environment effluent guidelines.


Congratulations of our minister, Dr. Bandy and his wife Lynne who became the proud parents of a baby girl, born on Thursday, November 24.

Mary Lawr underwent surgery at the Georgetown Hospital last week and we are pleased to report that she is progressing favourably.


Ruth Shortill is recovering at her home after surgery on her legs. We hope it won't be too long before she is well again.


