### Police beat

A 16-year-old Scarborough girl was arrested for break, enter and theft on the weekend as a result of a theft at a Limehouse home November 25. Police say she had resided at the home until September. Stolen was \$63 cash and a few bottles of

liquor. Vandals broke 31 windows at Robert Little Public School Sunday night causing an

estimated \$1,700 damage. Four Corvette rally wheels valued at \$300, were stolen from a car parked on Willow St., sometime during the night Friday to Saturday.

Vandals tried to cut down a poplar tree in Prospect Park sometime between November 24-25. The tree is expected to die as a result of the damage.

A 33-year-old Acton man was stopped by police on Main St. early Thursday morning and was charged with driving while having a suspended licence.

A 57-year-old Cameron St. resident has been charged with assault causing bodily harm after an incident at his home Thursday. He was visited by a boarder at his residence, say police, when he allegedly punched the man in the face. The victim was taken to Georgetown heopital with facial lacerations, where he was treated and released.

Police are investigating a November 28 break and enter at Momma Rosa Pizza on Mill St. West. Nothing was taken when thieves broke in through a rear window.

There was \$20 damage to the window. An Elizabeth Dr. residence was broken into at 2.50 a.m. November 28 resulting in \$300 damage. Police said nothing was taken in the incident.
