

Police beat

A 16-year-old Scarborough girl was arrested for break, enter and theft on the weekend as a result of a theft at a Limehouse home November 25. Police say she had resided at the home until September. Stolen was \$63 cash and a few bottles of liquor.

Four Corvette rally wheels valued at \$300, were stolen from a car parked on Willow St., sometime during the night Friday to Saturday.

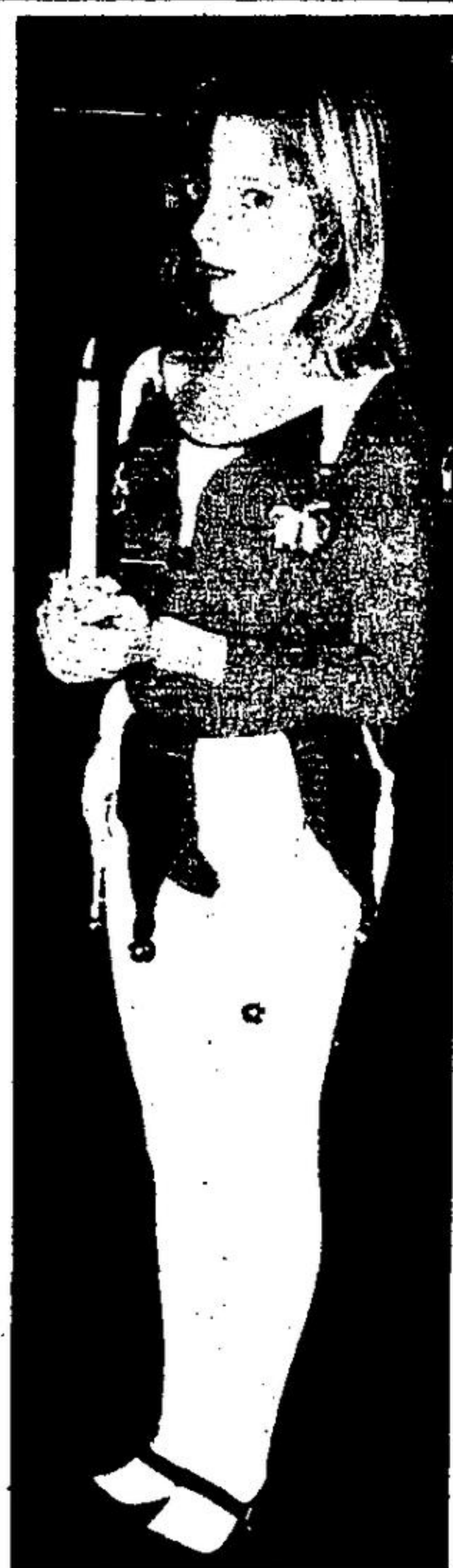
Vandals tried to cut down a poplar tree in Prospect Park sometime between November 24-25. The tree is expected to die as a result of the damage.
