HaltonPolice to challenge Province

The Police association of Ontario plans to challenge the provincial government in court over the controversial Bill 111, which eliminates independent wage and cost bargaining and puts it under the control of the Inflation Restraint Board.

At a police association meeting in Oakville's Howard Johnson's hotel November 17, association chairman Neil Jessop said the PAO "felt betrayed" by the government's action and hoped the issue could be settled out of court.

"We are going to ask for a meeting with Premier Davis, Treasurer Larry Grossman and the Solicitor General George Taylor immediately and indicate to them our deep concerns," he said.

The problem, claimed Jessop, is that under the proposed bill, the Inflation Restraint Board will become the arbitrator of police budget costs to the community.

Although the board will receive information on community policy costs, the association fears it will not receive enough data on police needs. Therefore its decisions will be one-sided, he said.

Because the police don't have the right to strike, wage and

budget awards made by independent arbitrators were intrinsic to the police bargain-

ing system, said Jessop. For years, the 20,000-member police association and the provincial government used these agents to settle wage and budget differences and both sides have been satisfied with their decisions in the past, according to Jessop.

"Now we're caught in the middle," said Jessop. "We can't get an independent budget and salary award. The government will now control it. They'll be giving us money and we don't want that," said Jessop.

If the meeting with Davis and his ministers is not productive, the PAO will challenge the Bill in the Supreme Court of Canada and will ask it to be declared unconstitutional the day it is enacted, said Jessop.

"We won't use the arbitration system in its present condition until the constitutional issue is decided in supreme court," he said.

If the independent arbitration process is not reinstated, Jessop said the government will lose the "dedicated" support of its police officers through the deterioration of morale.

He also said the police won't consider the right to strike because it's illegal.




