Rose McDonald

60 days in jail for dangerous driving

Rose Marie McDonald was sentenced Thursday to 60 days in jail for dangerous driving.

She was charged following a fatal car accident last April 28 in Guelph which claimed the life of Judy Lorraine Pierce of Mill St., Acton. Madonna Cooke of Kingham Rd., Acton, another passenger in the car, suffered serious injuries and spent two months in hospital.

In handing down his judgement on November 17, Judge H.R. Howitt, Guelph Provincial Court, pointed out Stone Rd. is a major artery with a controlled speed. The accused did not have a drivers licence and allowed her two passengers in the car without wearing their seat belts. He believed she must

have been going at a considerable speed to break the car in two when it hit a hydro pole.

Judge Howitt said nothing Thursday in handing down his 60 day jail sentence except that it will be served consecutively. McDonald was sentenced recently to 90 days in jail in Milton provincial court for five counts of fraud.

While defence lawyer Dave Doney acknowledged that he and his client were agreeing she had a previous criminal record none were for driving offenses and he urged leniency.

Crown attorney John Meagher noted one person had died in the accident and another was seriously hurt so a jail sentence was necessary.
