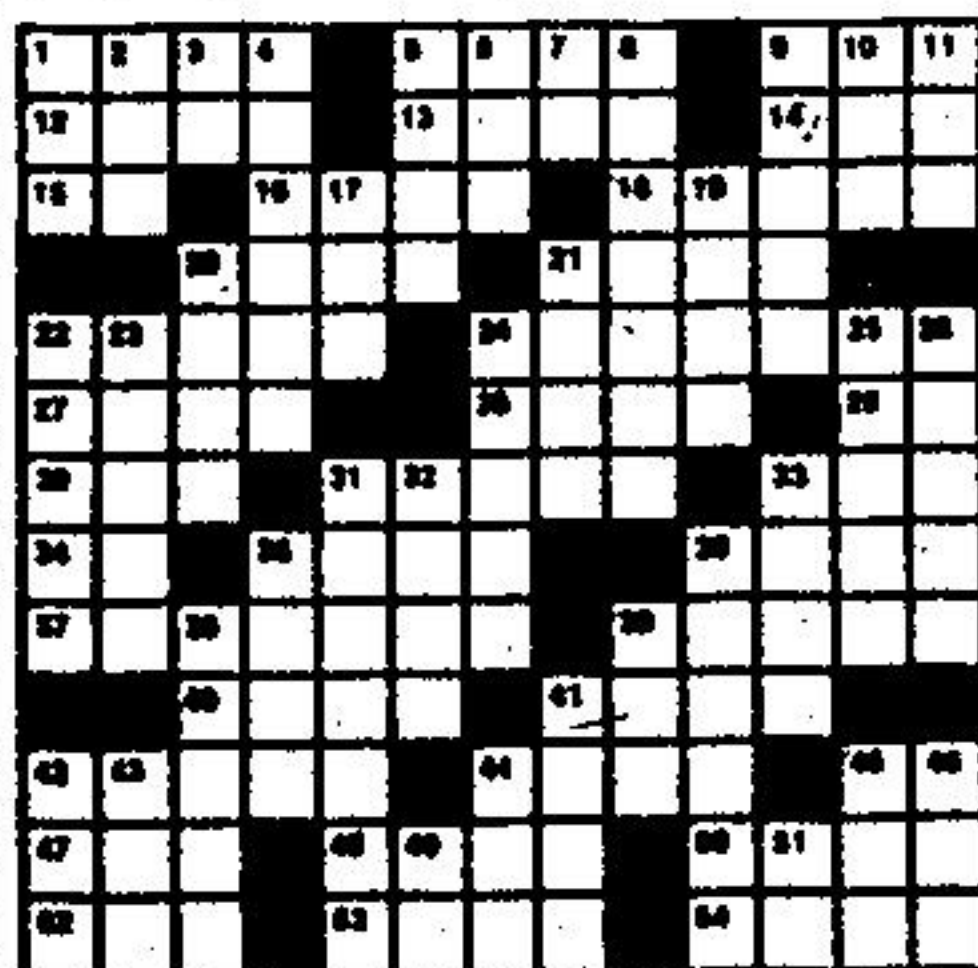
Streetsville Anniversary
