

### Walk-don't walk signals possible for Main-Mill

Walk-don't walk signals for the Main and Mill Streets intersection will be considered when the 1984 budget is struck.

If the signals are approved then the Halton Regional Police and schools will be asked to work on establishing a safety patrol for that intersection also.

A staff report stated the police didn't think a school crossing guard was needed at the intersection of Highways 7 and 25, but walkdon't walk signals would "assist both pedestrians and motorists." The signals would cost \$5,000 and pro-

vincial approval would be needed. Staff has included the \$5,000 in the proposed 1984 budget and the province has been advised of the proposal.

Acton resident Vicki Brigden noted twice in the fall her daughter was crossing the intersection properly but if she hadn't intervened her child would have been hit by a car. Signals are needed at the intersection because two highways meet there.

She said her preference all along was for walk-don't walk signals, but she requested a crossing guard because she thought there was no chance council would consider signals. She noted signals would benefit both children and other pedestrians using the intersection.


