

Remembering 1983

Two car crash

A collision at the intersection of Guelph St. and Lakeview St. in Georgetown on Friday resulted in damage to vehicles driven by two Actonians.

A car driven by Jonas Massey, 58, of 29 Scene St., Acton, had an estimated \$500 damage police say, and a car driven by Albert Ford, 64, of 56 Main St., North, Acton, had \$800 damage. There were no injuries.

\$1,800 damage

About \$1,800 damage resulted to a vehicle last Wednesday about 1.15 p.m. when the driver was travelling on Highway 24, 3 km north of Wellington County Rd. 29 in Eramosa Township and lost control. Guelph OPP say Marcia Gregg, 38, of RR 2, Acton, crossed the road, entered the ditch and rolled over.

Gregg and a passenger, seven-year-old Kathryn Gregg, were taken to Guelph General Hospital by a passing motorist.

Car-plow crash

There were no injuries when a car and a snow plow collided Friday morning on Con. 1-2 of Erin Township, 1 km. north of the Halton / Wellington townline.

Guelph OPP say Ken Tarzwell, 19 Union St., Georgetown was driving the snow plow, which suffered \$1,000 in damages and Andrew Lambden, 17, of RR 4, Guelph, was in the car which had \$2,000 damages. The accident happened at 9.15 a.m.

Car rolls over

Guelph OPP estimate \$2,200 damage to a car driven by David F. McClory, 38, RR 3 Acton after it rolled over on 17 Sideroad of Erin Township at 7.50 a.m. Jan. 1.

Police say McClory was southbound on 17 Sideroad and was going down a grade when he lost control on the slippery road.

Called to bonfire

Volunteer firefighters' New Year's Eve party was interrupted shortly after midnight when the men were called to a bon fire on Churchill Rd. about 12.30 a.m. January 1.

Icy road blamed for 3 car crash

Icy, snow packed roads were blamed for a three car collision at 1.40 p.m. December 28 on Highway 7, 2.5 kms east of County Road 27 in Eramosa Township.

Guelph OPP say Renata Zmija, 16, of 381 Weatherald St., Rockwood was stopped at Frederick, and pulled out onto the road to go east on Highway 7. She accelerated, police say and her rear end spun around, striking a car driven by Charlotte Lawrence, 39, 75 Cook St., Acton. The Zmija vehicle then slid sideways and hit a car driven by Rhonda Murray, 22, of 120 Bridge St., Rockwood.

Both the Murray and Lawrence vehicles were westbound on Highway 7.

There were no injuries, but police estimate \$500 damage to the Zmija car, and \$1,100 to the Murray vehicle. Lawrence's car was undamaged, police say.
