## Kuiken appointed

Halton Hills new regional councillor Jake Kuiken will have a full plate on council in the coming year. The rookie councillor, appointed in December, will take up posts in the region's Planning and Public Works Committee and the Halton Ecological and Environmental Advisory Committee in the new year.

## Transportation studied

DeLCan consulting engineers and planners of Don Mills will do a nine-month study of transportation for the disabled and the elderly in Halton, council has decided.

The \$48,000 study will look at the travel needs and service gaps for these groups throughout the region, and if required suggest solutions to any problems.

Halton will approach the provincial Ministry of Transportation and Communications for \$24,000 towards the study under their Transportation Program for the Physically Disabled.

## Seeks co-operation

Regional Chairman Pete Pomeroy sought to mend a rift on council when he nominated outspoken Regional Councillor Walter Mulkwich to serve on the Solid Waste Management Committee.

Mulkwich is a vehement opponent of Halton's plans to expand the Burlington dump and spearheads the fight on council to block the region in its chosen path.

Pomeroy told the planning committee, which accepted the nomination before it was approved by council December 21, that co-operation was needed to overcome Halton's garbage tribulations. The appointment was approved December 28.

## Fund EFW

Burlington Councillor Joyce Savoline wants the Region to establish a special tax-supported reserve fund for the construction of an energy-from-waste (EFW) facility in Halton.

Opposition came from Milton Councillor Bill Johnson who said a similar fund was established in the late seventies for a resource recovery facility, but council decided to use the funds to pay some of the costs involved in hearings over the proposed dump site in Milton.

He said he wouldn't support the establishment of the fund unless it could be guaranteed that a future council won't vote to use the fund for something else.

But Savoline urged council members to "put their money where their mouth is" and demonstrate to Halton residents that the Region is in fact dedicated to an EFW plant in Halton.

She told the members of the regional solid waste management committee that EFW will cost money and the Region is footing itself and the taxpayer if it continues to talk about the concept without setting money aside.
