prize in Canadian lottery history, sold an estimated 38 million tickets for Saturday's draw, with a 14 million to one chance of winning about \$7 million. And according to two ticket agents in town, Acton residents held their fair share of tickets.

knowing just how many tickets were sold in town, Brenda Hillier, of Jug City, pointed out sales were up by 10 to 15 per cent, with about 30 per cent of the tickets being sold to first time players.

Ed Crimless, of Ed's In 'N Out, says his employees sold about 20 to 25 per cent more than a normal week with 12 to 15 per cent to new players.
