## Needs of disabled

# Study looks at transportation

Halton's disabled population may be able to get around a little easier following a regional transportation study.

Councillors gave the green light recently to proceed with a \$48,000 study to examine transportation for the disabled. The Region will pick up half of the bill with the ministry of transportation and communications paying the remainder.

The study will be examining all the existing transportation services and programs for the disabled and frail-elderly to get an understanding of what is now being offered. A survey is expected to identify the transportation routes needed by the disabled and elderly.

The final part of the first phase is the assessment of the gaps and weaknesses in the region's transportation facilities for the disabled.

In the second phase of the study, a number of alternative solutions will be presented for the councillors to act on. The major problem the disabled face at

present is the lack of inter-regional travel available, explained project co-ordinator Dave McCleary.

Oakville, Burlington and Halton Hills all have transportation facilities for the disabled but they all work internally, he explained.

McCleary said the lack of accessibility available to the region's elderly could limit them from altending university and colleges outside the regional boundaries. Specialized hospitals are also difficult to reach when local transportation does not go beyond town borders.

McCleary said the study is an important step in identifying the needs of the community's disabled.

"Rather than running out and buying extensive equipment we have to look at the demands and the service groups providing these services.

"Before providing these services we have to make sure they are cost effective," he sald adding that it costs Toronto Transit \$15 per ride to transport the disabled.

Council appointed him to serve on the committee, last Wednesday, until November 30, 1984.




