An Acton couple escaped injury in a single vehicle crash on Highway 24 Saturday morning.
Guelph OPP say George Lee, 62, of 68 Churchill Rd. South and his wife Anna, 60, were southbound on Highway 24, about half a kilometre south of Wellington County Rd. 49 (the Everton Rd.), at about 10.30 a.m. The car hit a patch of ice and entered the east ditch where it struck a fence.
Police estimate damage to the car at \$1,000 and to the fence at \$150.

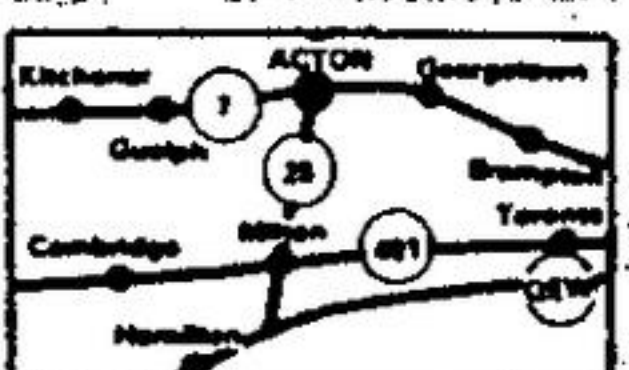

Household Hints From Prudence McNelly

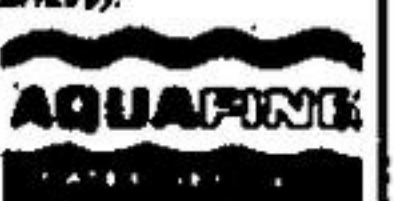


Plastic bowls won't develop bad odors if you store them filled with crumpled newspapers. Discard the newspaper when you use the bowl, and store next time with fresh paper.
