Oh, to be a Royal when it was really fun. It was long before the days when photographers would bound you on the ski slopes waiting to see you tumble on your imperial behind and when the fashion world kept its eyes glued to your wife for any hint of an impending change in coiffure.

It would have been about 800 years ago, during the reign of Henry II, King of England, when being a royal presonage meant you could spend a quiet Christmas at home with your wife, sons and mistress and celebrate with vice, black-intrigue and general corruption, when you had lands, armies and power.

Georgetown Little Theatre's production of Lion in Winter was greeted with a standing ovation Friday night after it showed that such an unlikely subject as internecine warfare can be dealt with in a thoroughly engaging and hilarious fashion.

Derek Joynes as Henry II and Florence O'Connor as his estranged wife Eleanor of Aquitaine are captivating as they plot against each other to have a favored son succeed Henry to the throne, and marry his mistress the French princess Alais Capet, played touchingly by Karen Ivany.


Choral Society spring concert
