Bennett art collection at Guelph University

Eighty important paintings and prints of the 1860-1930 period, valued at \$1 million and formerly owned by the late Stewart G. Bennett of RR 1 Georgetown, have been placed on permanent loan with the University of Guelph.

The paintings and prints, mostly by Canadian artists, are part of a private collection of 99 works of art bequeathed by the late Stewart and Letty Bennett to the Ontario Heritage Foundation. Eighteen of the works have been placed with the Art Gallery of Ontario, one with the Tom Thomson Memorial Gallery in Owen Sound. The balance will be housed in the Macdonald Stewart Art Centre adjacent to the University of Guelph campus.

Stewart Bennett enjoyed long and close association with the University of Guelph, and before that, its predecessor, the Federated Colleges of the Department of Agriculture, of which he was a member of

the Board of Regents. He was a charter member of the University's Board of Governors and served for 10 years until 1974. In the latter capacity he became aware of the extreme interest in the University's developing collection of Canadian art. Among the 80 paintings and prints from the Bennett estate that are now part of the University of Guelph collection, are works by artists not previously represented in particular Clarence Gagnon, James Wilson Morrice and Paul Peel

An inaugural exhibition of the complete Ontario Heritage Foundation Stewart and Letty Bennett Collection opened Friday at the Macdonald Stewart Art Centre.

The Bennett collection will be open for public viewing from March 2 through May 29, after which it will travel to Owen Sound, Sudbury, Sarnla, Simcoe, Peterborough, Sault Ste Marie and St. Catharines.
