Day Care

Regional Council is going to bat for day care in Halton which it feels is threatened by the province's 5 per cent limit on grant increases.

Regional Chairman Pete Pomeroy has requested a meeting with Minister of Community and Social Services Frank Drea to ask for more money.

Some private day care operators have said they may not accept regionally subsidized clients unless they get a grant increase that will cover their costs, anywhere from 6-10 per cent.

The region is also investigating the possibility of paying for increases above the 5 per cent limit out of its own pocket if the province refuses to budge from its position.
