Ontario Electoral Boundaries Commission NOTICE OF PUBLIC SITTING Proposed Provincial Electoral Boundaries

A public sitting of the Ontario Electoral Boundaries Commission will be held in Hamilton (Court House, 50 Main Street East, 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, April 25, 1984 and Thursday, April 26, 1984) for the proposed electoral districts of Brantford, Brant-Haldimand, Burlington, Halton-Burlington, Halton-Peel, Hamilton Centre, Hamilton East, Hamilton Mountain, Hamilton West, Oakville, Wentworth East and Wentworth West.

Below is the proposal for the electoral district of Halton-Peel.

The complete text of the Commission's proposals and the resolution of the Legislative Assembly appear in the Ontario Gazette of Feb. 11, 1984.

Rules of procedure governing public sittings of the Ontario Electoral Boundaries Commission 1983 for the hearing of representations or objections by interested parties, in accordance with the resolution of the Legislative Assembly.

1. Notice of public sittings of the Commission shall be published in the Ontario Gazette together with the proposals of the Commission for the redistribution of electoral boundaries at least 42 calendar days prior to the public sittings to which the proposals apply.

2. At any public sitting of the Commission, representations or objections from interested parties will be heard and considered to the extent that they apply to the Commission's proposals relating to the electoral districts for which the sitting is held; any decision on relevance shall rest with the Commission.

3. Representations or objections may be made orally or in writing, or both.

4. Subject to Rule 6, the Commission will hear representations or objections only from those interested individuals or groups who have signified their intention to make them by lodging written notice with the Commission within 23 calendar days from the date of the

publication of this advertisement and such notice shall state the place and time of the sitting at which they propose to be heard.

5. Representations or objections on behalf of associations or groups shall be made by one person.

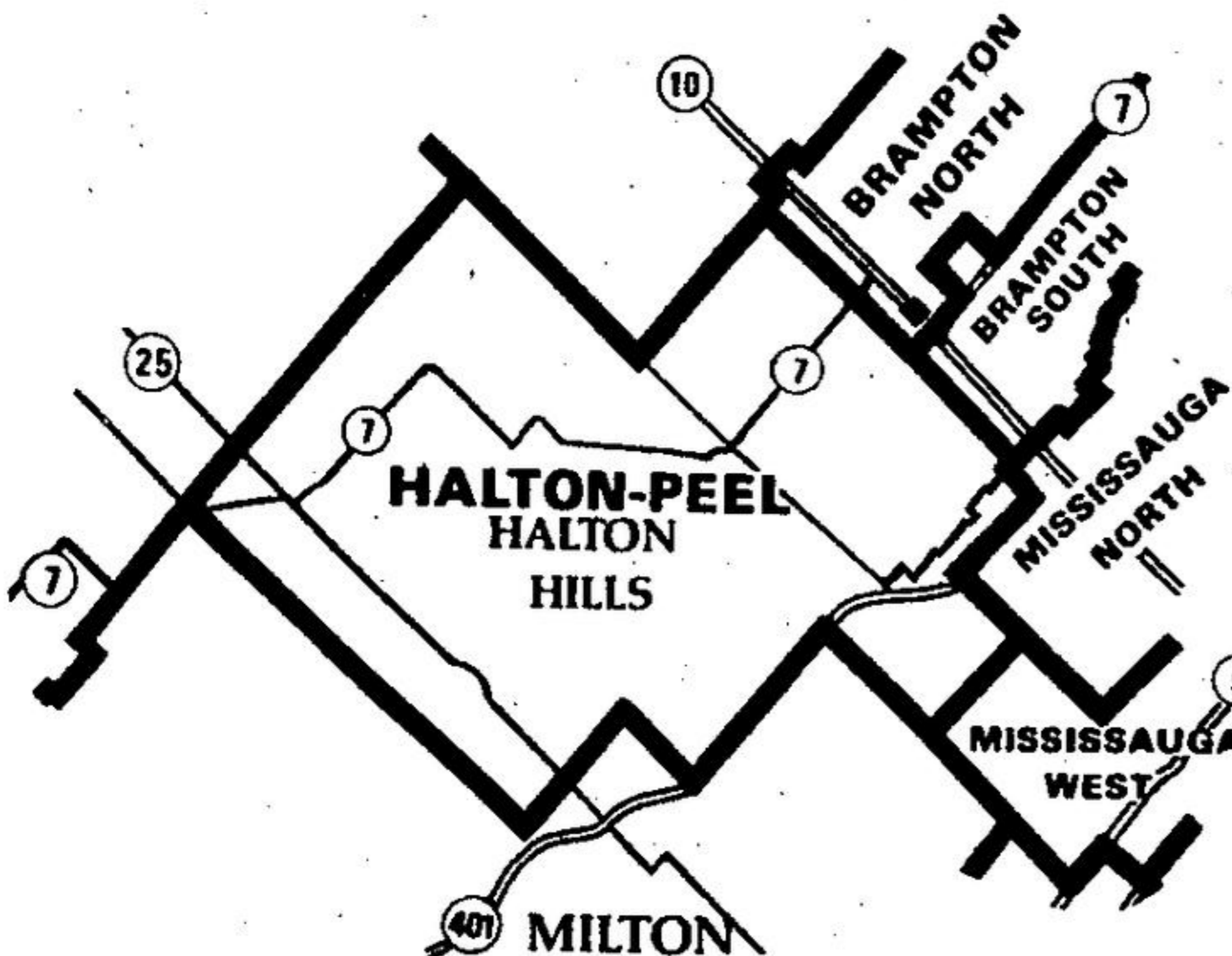
6. The Commission in its discretion may receive and consider at any public sitting relevant representations from any Member of the Legislature who appears in person, whether or not the Member has complied with the requirement for notice in Rule 4.

7. If it appears to the Commission that all the relevant representations and objections cannot be made during the time allotted for public sittings in any advertised place, sittings may be adjourned or postponed and the Commission shall give such oral or written public notice of their resumption as it considers adequate in the circumstances.

8. If no notice is lodged in accordance with Rule 4, a sitting may be cancelled at the discretion of the Commission.

Electoral District of Halton-Peel

— consists of the Town of Halton Hills, that part of the City of Brantford lying westerly of McLaughlin Road, and that part of the City of Mississauga lying northerly of a line described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the northerly limit of the City of Mississauga with Second Line West; thence southerly along Second Line West to Derry Road; thence westerly along Derry Road to Erin Mills Parkway; thence northerly along Erin Mills Parkway to Derry Road; thence westerly along Derry Road to Millcreek Drive; thence southeasterly along Millcreek Drive to Fifth Line West; thence southerly along Fifth Line West to Battleford Drive; thence southeasterly along Battleford Drive to Erin Mills Parkway; thence southerly along Erin Mills Parkway to Britannia Road; thence westerly along Britannia Road to the westerly limit of the City of Mississauga.

Students cut off busing lack

The French Immersion program is the only one offered by Halton Board of Education for which the board does not provide transportation, a brief submitted by Patricia Stuart-Hagge and Joseph Hagge states.

It is one of several briefs on the subject heard by the board's Transportation Policy Review Committee Tuesday night. This one focusses on equality of access by all students to all programs.

Children are being excluded from French Immersion because some parents cannot drive their children to the program, the brief argues, and cites working parents, single parent families, no car available, illness of a parent driver, young children who must be taken along with school-age children, and parents with children in different programs, as specific examples.

The Haggas termed the policy unjust and discriminatory, and emphasized of the 40 boards in Ontario with a French Immersion program, over 75 per cent include transportation.

Parents spend much more in private transportation for children who must attend a school away from their home area, than would be spent collectively for the same transportation, the brief states.

Chimney fire gets out of hand

A chimney fire at a Cobblehill home Saturday evening got out of hand and spread to the walls according to Halton Hills fire chief Bill Cunningham.

Firefighters had to pry panelling from the wall in order to get to the flames, which caused about \$2,500 damage.

The chief blames an improperly installed wood burning device for the fire.

Artists receive Arts grants

Ontario Arts Council grants have been given to six area artists. Filmmakers Brian Lemay, Georgetown and Terrence Kitchen, Acton will receive up to \$25,000.

Under the craftsman program Agnes Olive, Terra Cotta, and Larry Davidson, Acton, will be awarded up to \$4,000.

\$5,000 will go to David Steen, Terra Cotta as a writer's award, and Madeline Kronby, Milton will benefit by a grant up to \$4,500 under the artist in school and community program.

A total of \$2,663,315 was awarded by Ontario Arts Council, covering 160 arts organizations and 494 individual artists.
