# Irish beauty-Mountains of Mourne

Catherine Graham of RR 1, Limehouse writes an article annually about her native Ireland for this newspaper on the eve of St. Patrick's Day, Eire's national holiday. This year she has chosen the Mountains of Mourne as her subject. Catherine was born in Mourne.

#### The Mountains Mourne

This massive range of mountains known as the Kingdom of Mourne, runs 14 miles along the coast between Newcastle and Rostrevor and are seven miles in width. It comprises 40 domed shaped peaks the highest being Donard and Bingham. They are famous for their granite; it is very fine in grain and colour and takes a high polish.

The Mourne men were famous in days gone by for being stone cutters. Today they have been replaced by machinery. Irish diamonds and rock crystals were often found amongst the granite.

The name "Mourne" is said

to be derived from a branch of the McMahon clan, who migrated from County Monaghan around the middle of the twelfth century. Around the end of the same century the Normans invaded Ireland and pushed back the settlers from the coastal districts. To this day descendants of the old clans still live in the foothills of the "Mournes".
