## Pancakes, syrup at Orangeville

Maple syrup and pancakes are what's cooking at the 8th Annual Maple Syrup Festival, sponsored by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

The festival is being held at the Orangeville Reservoir Conservation Area on the weekends of March 24 and 25; March 31 and April 1; and April 7 and 8, 1984 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. A day's activities include wagon rides, trips to the sugar shack to see how maple syrup is made, guided tours, and the newly added Woodsmen Competition.

Pancakes will be provided by the Orangeville Rotary Club at only \$2.50 for two pancakes and a drink. The pancakes will be served inside the heated Interpretive Centre.

Festival goers will also be able to purchase maple syrup products, view displays featuring past and present techniques of how maple syrup is made and participate in the first Annual Woodsmen Competition which takes place at 12 noon and 2 p.m. every day throughout the weekends of the festival. Groups of four can test their skills in the following woodsmen events: woodsplitting, tree felling, log sawing and pulp toss for distance. The competition is open to everyone.

# Watercolors, blown glass exhibited at House Sol

Jennifer Chanter-Colby, well-known watercolorist from Brighton, Ontario, returns to Gallery House Sol for an exhibition from Saturday, March 17 to April 5, 1984. She will exhibit 30 new paintings with the title "Presqu'ile Winter".

Last summer the federal government sent her on a painting trip to the high Arctic and when she returned to her home her eyes were tuned to the many different whites of winter. Her new paintings are all about those variations.

Jennifer Chanter-Colby graduated from Sir George Williams University and did post-graduate teaching at McGill University. For five years she was an apprentice of the Master-Ceramist Jarko Zavi. 


