Clergy Association puts on Lenten series

The Acton Clergy Association's annual four week series of Lenten noon hour luncheon-services began today (Wednesday, March 28) at Acton Baptist Church.

Rev. Dr. Murray J.S. Ford is the guest speaker for the series.

The series is entitled "Offerings On The Way To The Cross" and today's theme is from Matthew 20 on the Gift of Perspective.

Next week, April 4, Rev. Ford speaks about the Gift of Worship from Matthew 21 and on April 11 the topic is the Gift of Freedom from Matthew 23.

The series concludes on April 18 with remarks from Matthew 24:13, the Gift of Endurance.

Born in Calgary, Rev. Ford served in the RCAF from 1941-45. He received his B.A. and B.D. from McMaster University and earned his M.A. from Columbia University. He took his Doctor of Religion at Chicago Theological Seminary.

An ordained Baptist minister, Rev. Ford is professor in charge of the Christian Ministry Divinity College, McMaster University.

Request upsets taxpayer

An application for a gravel pit license by Eramosa Township Reeve Murray Cox has raised the ire of at least one area taxpayer.

George Day wrote a letter to the council protesting Cox's application, citing it as morally offensive, although it is probably legal. Day was concerned there was a conflict of interest on Cox's part.

Township clerk Lloyd Hindley pointed out the reeve declared a conflict of interest from the beginning, and left the room for all discussions pertaining to his application.

Hindley noted his request is under con-

sideration, and pointed out there must be an amendment to the township official plan and a zoning bylaw change before the license can be granted. Any objections at this stage can be taken to the Ontario Municipal Board by the public, if anyone objects.

Cox has 30 acres at Lots 27 and 28, Concession, Eramosa Township, from which he wishes to extract gravel. Hindley explained there will be an agreement drawn up between the township and Cox Farms regarding the upkeep of the roads used as truck routes.

Heart fund hits \$5,300

The 1984 Heart Fund drive in Acton was a huge success raising \$5,304.62, \$500 over target.

Chairman Vic Bristow announced the great results Monday and praised the efforts of his 155 canvassers.

The residential campaign collected \$3,995, up \$559 from last year.

Rose Boxes in local stores brought in another \$173.62, a \$37 increase over last year, while the Industrial canvass produced \$355, \$133 more than in 1983. The commercial canvass took in \$601, up \$79 from last year.

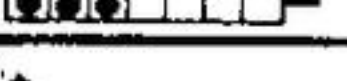
The appeal to organizations was the only drive which didn't produce increased donations, \$200 came from organizations, down \$25 from last year.

Bristow also announced that between April 1, 1983, and March 1, 1984, memorial donations to the heart fund in Acton produced another \$4,700, though he noted this is quite separate from the February fund raising campaign.
