To qualify under the pattern adaptation class, there must be at least three changes to the pattern and a description of these altera-

tions included. Categories are: clothing, includes adult and children designs; accessories, which could include purses, jewelry, make-up bags, slippers, etc.; decorator items, including picture frames, dolls, cushions, wall hangings, etc.; and specific stitchery items, which includes any fabric item incorporating any specific needle art.

All these categories have two classes: a.) with pattern; b.) original design (no pattern) or pattern adaptation.

The contest is in conjunction with Ontario's Bicentennial and the Fabric Shoppe's fifth anniversary.

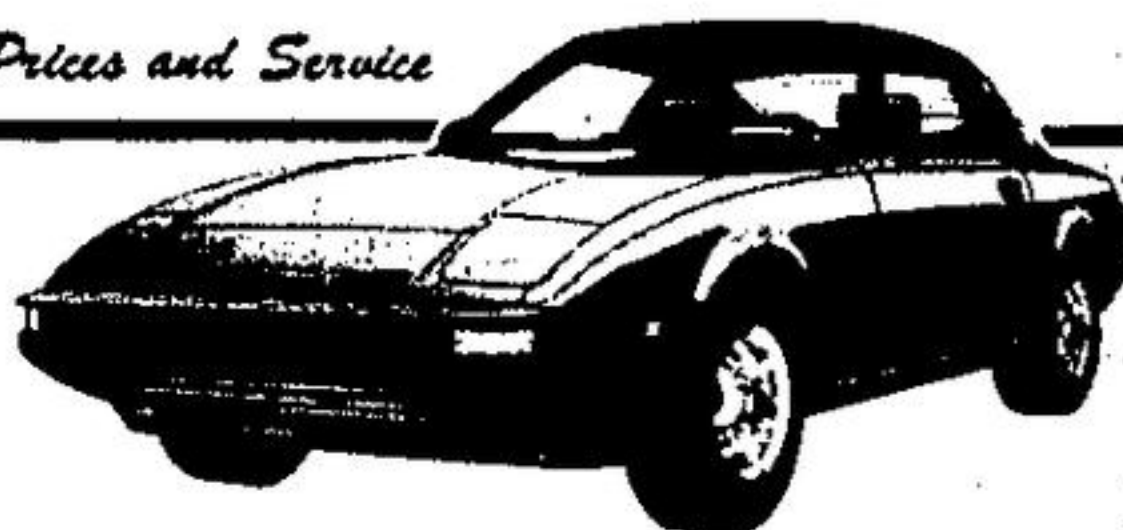

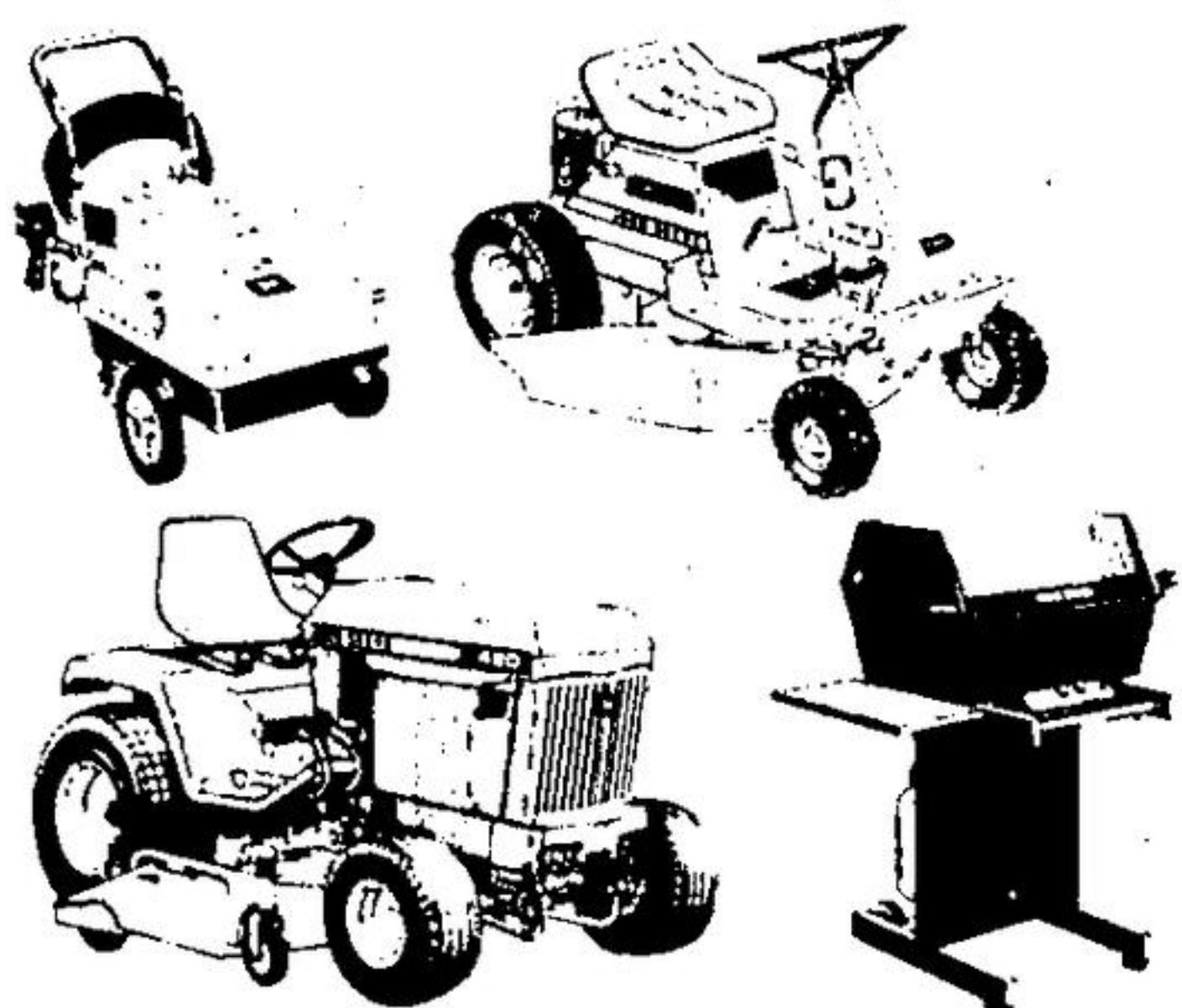
