# Golden Agers to celebrate Acton's, Ontario's birthdays

Acton's Golden Age club, which is 20-years-old this month, would like to get involved in celebrating Acton's 110th birthday and Ontario's Bicentennial.

Friday club spokesman Bob MacArthur attended council drop-in in find out what celebration plans have been made so far.

Councillor Ross Knechtel noted Halton Hills received \$10,000 from Queen's Park to fund Bicentennial celebrations and some of the money is coming to Acton for the Heritage Acton-Acton Chamber of Commerce-Acton BIA sponsored Leathertown Market and Ciderfest celebration at the end of August.

Councillor Rick Bonnette, who sits on the Town's Bicentennial committee, noted the committee hasn't worked out all the grants yet.

He said as far as the committee knows the only event planned yet for Acton is the Leathertown Market weekend. He added maybe the fall fair will do something beyond "their usual excellent job."

Both Bonnette and Knechtel urged the Golden Age Club let them know if they come up with any ideas for celebrations.

MacArthur admitted the club hasn't really discussed a celebration much.

The councillors urged the club get involved with Leathertown Market by calling Ted Tyler, Ed Wood or Steve Dawkins, if they aren't doing anything independently.

MacArthur observed the club getting involved with Leathertown Market might be difficult since they shut down for July and August annually.

Bonnette noted there were some other grant requests from the Acton area besides for the Leathertown Market, but they had to be rejected since they didn't meet criteria. Criteria involves a project having an Ontario's Bicentennial theme, as required by the province.

MacArthur said the Golden Agers will pursue their role in celebrations further.
