Author speaks on Loyalists

With one out of seven Canadians assumed to be of Loyalist descent, an evening at Georgetown Library, April 11 with author Christopher Moore discussing his new book "The Loyalists: Revolution, Exile and Settlement", should be of wide-spread interest.

The book to be released in May, deals with the exodus of 35,000 American Loyalists into Canada at the close of the Revolutionary War.

This sudden influx led directly to the foundation of the provinces of Ontario and New Brunswick, both of which celebrate their bicentennial this year.

The program is co-sponsored by Esqueing Historical Society and Halton Hills Public Libraries.

Rock concerts recall Wireless

Canada's rock and roll community has always been close-knit by show business standards, and this Friday and Saturday nights Georgetown music fans get a chance to see and hear a local band pay tribute to an important forerunner.

Foxx, a Georgetown progressive rock band, has almost sold out the first of two-night live tribute to Wireless, one of Toronto's most popular club acts through the late 1970s. Fronted by guitarists Frank Fox, 19 and Randy Richardson, 28, and featuring Steve Skingley, 18, on bass and lead vocals and Brandon Ferguson, 19, on

drums, Foxx takes to the John Elliott Theatre stage for two 8 p.m. concerts Friday and Saturday.

Concert-goers will be able to buy Wireless albums as well as hearing their music showcased when Foxx runs through the Anthem recording artists' repertoire. A full concert sound system and lighting handled by Jack Hayes ought to guarantee audiences their money's worth, according to co-ordinator/producer Mike Beeny.

Tickets cost \$4 and are available at Nell's Music Centre, Donut Time, the Roxy and at the cultural centre box office.
