Trial starts May 17

Robert A. Noble and Robert Noble Ltd. will face a variety of charges under the environmental protection act on May 17.

Crown and defence counsel agreed to the date in Milton Provincial Offences court Thursday before Justice of the Peace M.H. Allen.

The court was told by the Ministry of Environment's

lawyer that the trial could last as long as a week since there will be at least a dozen witnesses and stacks of documents filed as exhibits.

Justice of the Peace Allen noted he only sits in that court half days, handling bail hearing the rest of the day. He said if the case proves to go beyond one morning, it can be continued for as many half days as necessary.

Region's share tax dollar up slightly

Halton Hills and the board of education's share of each tax dollar from this municipality has gone down slightly, while the region's portion has gone up slightly.

Monday night council passed a bylaw setting the taxes it collects for all three levels of government.

In Acton 33.8 cents of each tax dollar goes to the Town (down .1 of a cent from last year); education 52.5 cents (down .5 of a cent) region 18.7 cents (up .6 of a cent).

For Georgetown, the portion of each tax dollar for Halton

Hills remains unchanged at 30.9 cents. However, the education share went down .5 of a cent and the region's share went up by the same amount.

Esqueuing taxpayers will give Halton Hills 28.3 cents of each tax dollar (down .3 of a cent) and 56 cents for education (down .4 of a cent). The region's share went up to 17.7, an increase of .7 of a cent.

In total Halton Hills taxpayers will give the Town \$5,114,675; \$9,189,504 for education and \$2,919,664 for the region. The grand total of local taxes collected in Halton Hills is pegged at \$17,223,843.
