Gulf, Texaco win tenders

Gulf Oil and Texaco have won tenders to supply fuel to Halton Hills.

Monday night council approved the tender from Gulf for both regular and unleaded gasoline while Texaco won the contract to supply diesel fuel. This was a co-operative Halton tender. The region called the tender for itself and the member municipalities.

Bridge, culvert maintenance set at \$75,975

Maintenance of bridges and culverts on Town roads and replacing and putting in new culverts is expected to cost \$75,975 in 1984.

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications subsidizes the Town for these works, the recently passed Halton Hills budget calls out.

The budget calls for \$51,550 to be spent on culvert replacement and installation and \$11,000 on culvert maintenance.

Bridge maintenance costs are pegged at \$13,425.

For bridges and culverts the Town will spend \$35,800 on materials.
