'84 Town plowing budget over \$200,000

The Town plans to spend over \$200,000 on snow plowing and removal in 1984.

Snow plowing is slated to cost Halton Hills \$68,095, according to the recently approved municipal budget.

Snow removal will add \$13,900 in costs to the Town's winter maintenance program.

Sanding of roads is expected to cost \$65,175 and buying a stockpile of sand and salt \$3,200. The bill for salting is expected to be \$33,200.

Putting up snow fences has been budgeted to cost \$13,500 and \$1,500 has been set aside to pay for thawing culverts.

Keeping equipment on standby for the winter should cost \$16,300 and the winter road patrol \$10,000.

These jobs will be subsidized by the province.

Buying snow fence will cost \$3,000 this year and sidewalk snow removal and plowing \$4,000. These jobs aren't subsidized by the province.

"Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; therefore let us keep the feast." And many millions throughout the world did keep the feast. Churches were packed throughout Christendom as we celebrated Jesus Christ's victory over sin and death.

But the Sunday after Easter has traditionally been known as "Low Sunday," because, somehow, the Message has not permeated into the hearts of vast numbers of Christians because they do not faithfully attend Church each Sunday.

I believe that faithfulness involves a good measure of sacrifice on the part of Christ's disciples—if, in fact we are His disciples. Jesus gives us an everlasting or ultimate quality of being alive, as a human being here and now, a special Grace that gives vitality to our emotions (desires) and to our willing and doing (bringing into effect). In other words, the Resurrection of our Lord revitalizes our living, giving it a hope of life beyond life and accountability. You see, being a disciple of Jesus means that we are to be co-workers with God in His universe that He is fashioning, yes, His creative power never ends!

To live the Risen Life each day of our lives is not easy. It takes discipline, commitment and perseverance. It is a continual "laying down of our will" to the "will of God." "Not my will but Yours be done, O Lord," are familiar words—recall them the next time you say the Lord's Prayer!

What is life all about anyway? It is not self-fulfilling enterprise that puts "I" in the centre of our activities, but Life is a constant dialogue with Almighty God asking Him to help us sort through our selfish desires so that we might get to the very essence of what life really is—serving God's will and not our own. If this kind of pursuit in life leaves you cold, then the Easter Message has passed you by. To live the Resurrection Life is to walk with Jesus and to be attuned to His call to follow Him in service.
