





Libraries gear up for project

Halton Hills library staff is gearing up for a hectle year of inter-library communications as new computer equipment is installed in a pilot project funded by the province. "It should be an interesting next nine

months," chief librarian Betsy Cornwell told the library board last Wednesday. Queen's Park has selected the newlyrealigned Escarpment regional library system, of which Halton Hills is a part, to test a computer-based telecommunications system expected to employ the latest tech-

nology. At the same time, the Halton Hills libraries will continue to operate their own closed-circuit teleprinter system, which Cornwell describes as "obsolete and inefficient for the size of our area".

The province has allocated \$1.3 million to a program that, by the end of the decade, should unify all Ontario libraries under a computer control system. The initial \$300,000 goes to the Escarpment region for testing.

Cornwell said that while the new system has yet to be designed, it will likely be patterned after the Bell Canada or CNCP systems.

With the expansion of the old South Central Library System to include Peel, Hamilton-Wentworth, Haldimand-Norfolk and Niagara region libraries, Cornwell also told board members, there is a possibility that Caledon's three branches might be incorporated.

Another \$50,000 BILD grant is available from the province to expand existing services, she explained. The final criteria defining the term "expansion" won't be circulated for another month, she said, but could entail adding the Caledon libraries to the new Escarpment region system.
