by Pat Kentner On the way to the theatre Saturday to watch Georgetown Theatre's production, "On Golden Pond", I wondered how they could transfer the story, which takes place at a lakeside summer cottage, to the stage. Their

ingenuity provided the answer. Entering the thratre one is immediately struck by the set constructed for this play. A cottage atmosphere with fireplace, cozy furniture, barnboard siding, strikes just the right note. Linda Roe's mural, seen through windows at the back of the set, is so well donewith lake, trees, far off hills, horizon, pin-pointing lights of distant cottages, giving you a total feeling that, indeed, you are at a summer cottage.

ments Ron as the co-star in this gentle story.

Ron Hunt, as Norman Thayer, opens the show, and is a pleasure to watch. His performance as an aging, ornery but loveable man, fighting off infirmities of old age as best he can, meeting each day with enthusiasm, carrying on a longloving relationship with his wife Ethel, holds the audiences attention throughout the play. Ron brings a warmth to his character and a naturalness that I found very moving. He usually takes a character or secondary part and it is quite impressive to see him handle this leading role with such a firm grasp.

The story, concerns an aging couple, who arrive at their cottage for the summer, as they have done for many years, for a holiday. They are visited by their daughter, a divorcee, who brings with her, her new fiance and his son by a former marriage. The son is left with Norman and Ethel for a holiday while the younger couple travel and later return. Their relationships and how they are affected by each other is the basis for the entire play.

Jackie Willows is daughter Chelsea and John Carter is boyfriend Bill; a young actor. Dax Urbszat, plays the boy Billy, and handles his role well.

Special mention should be made of David Williams. As the postman and former childhood boyfriend of daughter Chelsea, who drops in periodically for coffee and cake, he adds an enjoyable touch of humor. Although his role is smaller, he never missed evoking chuckles from the audience when he appeared on stage.

An enjoyable evening. Listening to the murmurs of approval from the Saturday crowd, supports my own feeling that the play is very well done, well acted, and was a pleasure to attend.
