changed. Budget committee in particular should be open, the public needs a glimpse at the tough lobbying, bargaining and sweating that goes into striking a budget. It's one of council's most important jobs, a job the public should have the chance to evaluate each of its representatives doing. (Pam agreed).

Pam doesn't quarrel with the notion of budget committee being open.

However, she notes, Committee of Adjustment and council committees shouldn't be marred in the same issue. Council committee's only make recommendations, assemble information and give suggestions, they don't render legal decisions like Committee of Adjustment.

We discussed the notion that council is a rubber stamp for its major working committees, a view held by some councillors and a good reason for opening up budget committee meetings. We even discussed some specific examples of rubber stamping. My contention was that since committees are in effect making the decisions, that wasn't much different than committee of adjustment meeting behind closed doors to debate an application. The decision making was being done in-camera in both cases. We agreed to disagree.

But, Pam did raise a valid point. If council sometimes is a rubber stamp, and she didn't disagree that is sometimes the case, who is at fault? Isn't it the councillors fault, many of whom she feels don't speak up enough at council and question the "status quo." And wouldn't the councillors talking about the need to open up meetings be equally at fault since they too aren't questioning enough things and are helping rubber stamp things?

Pam agrees council's act could use some cleaning up on this issue, but doesn't feel that diminishes the validity of the mission to open up Committee of Adjustment. This is just a case of her noticing what Committee of Adjustment was doing and not noticing what council was doing. And besides, it certainly looks like all her council colleagues hadn't noticed the similarity either, until just recently.

Okay, fair enough. Now let's just see both budget committee of council and Committee of Adjustment doing all their work in public.




