of the increase last week. Based on an average assessed home of \$3,000 in Rockwood the \$45.89 increase is a 4.9 per cent jump. The \$36 increase in Eramosa Township based on an average assessed home of \$3,000 constitutes a 3.8 per cent hike.

Revenue last year totaled \$1,772,911. This year the total revenue required is \$1,874,409. The school board will receive 60 per cent of tax revenues, the county will receive 15 per cent, and the remaining 25 per cent will be spent locally.




