Deadline nears for essayists

There's only two weeks left before the due date in the Esqueing Historical Society's Bicentennial Essay Contest, featuring cash prizes.
Essays in categories for all ages must be postmarked no later than June 15 and mailed to the Society at Box 51, Georgetown, L7G 4T1.
The Society is hoping local students and other would-be writers help members take a Bicentennial look at Esqueing's past and, in one case, its present.
Elementary school students can enter Category 1 by writing an essay of 300 words or less on a past or present Esqueing resident. The subject does not have to be a prominent member of the community. Prizes are \$15 for the best essay, \$10 for second, \$5 for third and \$2 each for fourth through eighth.
High school students are invited to outline the history of any Esqueing school opened prior to 1950 in 300 words or less. Prizes are \$20, \$15 and \$10.
Adult entrants can choose from two categories and need not limit their essays to 300 words. Prizes in both groups are \$40, \$15 and \$10.
Category 3 entails early memories of an Esqueing community, including recollections of people or events.
Category 4 seeks essays on the history of any group or organization from Esqueing.
The Society has received financial assistance in the project from the town of Halton Hills and the Ontario Bicentennial Committee.
