It won't be long now before reconstruction begins for the summer in the Glenlea area on Meadvale and Westcott roads.

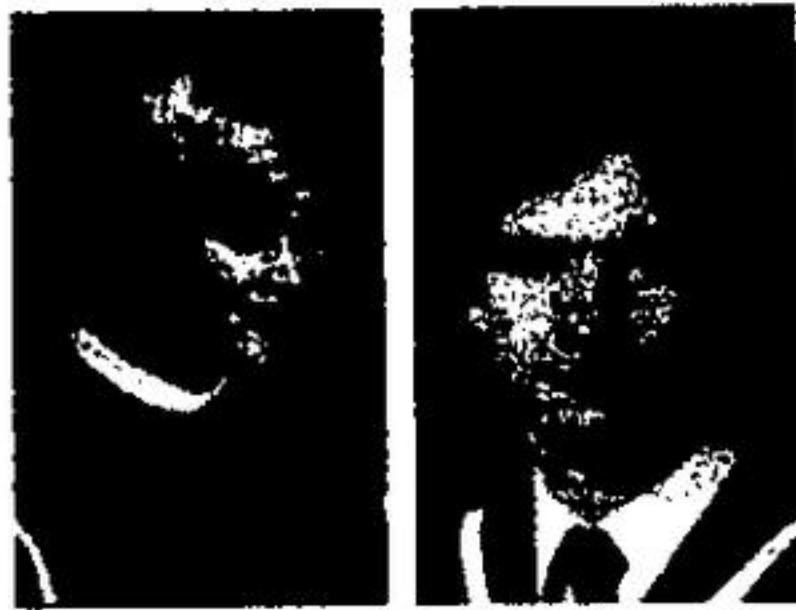
Monday night Halton Hills council approved a bylaw authorizing the project.
