Arts Council seeks big planning role

Hoping to reshape its role in the community, the Halton Arts Council is laying plans for a task force to examine the town's cultural future.

Re-elected president Wendy Buykes of Georgetown proposed the "rather challenging task" to members at the Council's annual general meeting last Wednesday night at the cultural centre.

The time has come, she said, to determine what the council can do to help the town further develop fine arts programs and general interest. Among the suggestions to be considered is the modification of the town recreation department as a "culture and recreation" department.

Plans for a panel discussion about the task force idea fell through when intended participant Tom Shepard, head of the recreation and parks department, was unable to attend the annual meeting because of a medical emergency in his family.

Shepard's failure to tell the meeting's organizers that he could not attend and a lack of interest in the meeting among town councillors-only John McDonald responded to the Council's formal invitations-left members annoyed and discouraged.

"As taxpayers, some of the people at the meeting were really quite annoyed," Buykes told this newspaper. "We're not a very large group, but we would like to be doing something useful," member Pat Hretchka added.

Tentative discussion about the task force idea took place with another panel member. John Elliott Theatre manager Hank Huhlanen.

Other business included the election of officers, which saw Buykes retain the president's seat after serving part of one term following the daparture of Betty Fisher. Joining Buykes on the executive are vice-

president Deborah Sankey of Acton, secretary Ralph Ursel of Georgetown and treasurer Eunice McGowan, also of George-

In her address to members, Buykes proposed a new comittee to include representatives of the Council, the recreation department, town council and local visual and theatrical arts.

The committee would delve into the town's 1979 Master Parks and Recreation Plan to determine whether any direction is given for local arts involvement and plans to check with arts councils in neighboring communities to see what kind of role they


