The heavy rain and electrical storms of the past weekend bring back some hair raising experiences. When fishing far from shore and lightning starts to fly about, it is to say the least, the wrong place to be especially when in an aluminum boat.
In a situation such as this the best thing to do is to stay low in the boat and start heading for the nearest shore. Once on land find shelter away from tall single trees.

An extraordinarily large number of lodges with short fly-in trips were featured at the sportsmen's show with plenty of success so it seems many anglers that normally make eight or 10 local trips are now opting for one good trip into lakes that are not so heavily

fished. This is something that our friends from the USA have enjoyed here for a good many years, usually booking trips here from predominantly American lodges and fly-in services.
Changing the game laws to finally catch up to fly-in trips, where declaration of catches are mandatory, have probably cut down on bookings from the US and along with the high cost of travelling and fuel these trips are becoming more acceptable to Ontario anglers.
It's not always the longest fly-in trips that have the best fishing either as there are some lakes that are only 10 minutes air time away where not even snowmobiles can make it in so why not try it in Ontario.
