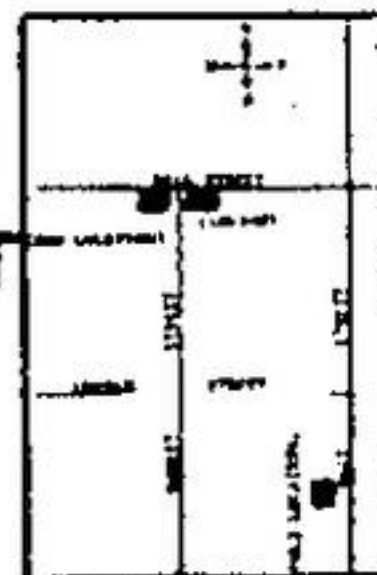

School boards, Region to meet

The top guns from Halton Region and its boards of education will meet whenever necessary as a new liaison committee to discuss items of mutual concern.

In a modified version of a proposal to revive liaison between Regional Council and the school boards, which lapsed in 1982 after eight years of operation, the new committee will include Regional Chairman Pete Pomeroy, Chief Administrative Officer Dennis Ferlin, Halton Board of Education Chairman Betty Fisher, Halton Board of Education Director Wally Beaver, Halton Separate School Board Chairman Rev. James Mihm and Separate School Director Clifford Byrnes.

Representatives of the three bodies met in February and agreed there are enough matters of common interest to warrant a revived liaison committee.

They also decided that representation on the committee, a sub-committee of the regional health and social services committee, should involve the heads of each body and their seconds-in-command.

A previous proposal would have seen the committee comprised of board trustees and regional councillors as well as staff from the region's health and social service departments and the school boards.

Specific topics for the liaison committee have not yet been openly discussed, although the sale of alcohol at Halton schools outside school hours is one likely example.
