Residents of the home for the aged were rewarded for their patience three weeks ago when the five-month construction period ended. The \$160,000 facility is housed in what was the laundry room until 1975.

The Manor Auxiliary, the group credited with starting the craft program, handed over a cheque for \$10,000 to administrator Garth Johns Sunday. That amount is just one of many contributions auxiliaries have made in this area, which include providing most of the craft supplies.

The Lions Club of Milton equalled the auxiliary's most recent donation

and also was recognized along with Halton Sportsmen's Association and the Ladies Auxiliary of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 136.

Along with funding provided by Halton Region and the Ministry of Community and Social Services, bursaries from the estates of Elsie Whilsmith and Hazel Leslie made construction of the room possible.

After all settled down the president opened the meeting with a lovely poem.

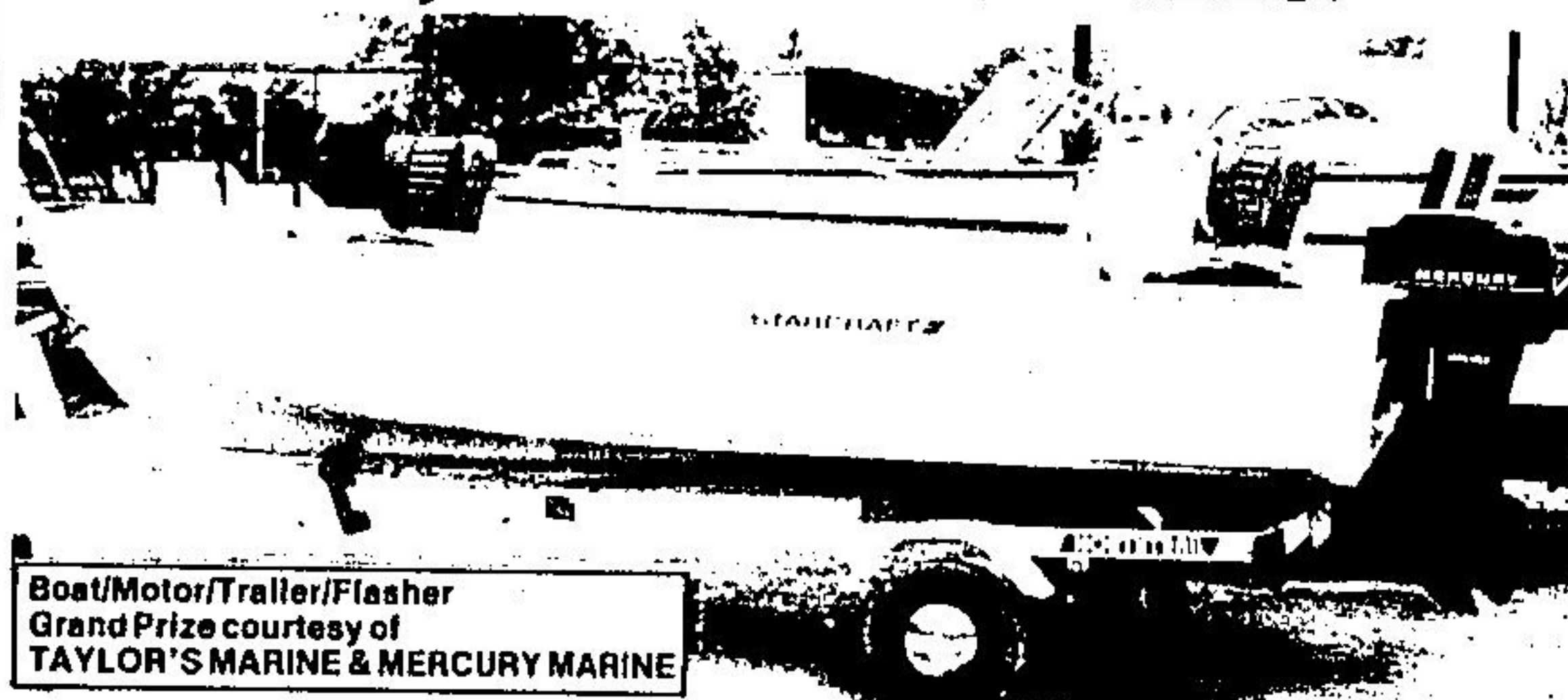
Roll Call "What is your favorite day of the week? Why?" was answered by all.

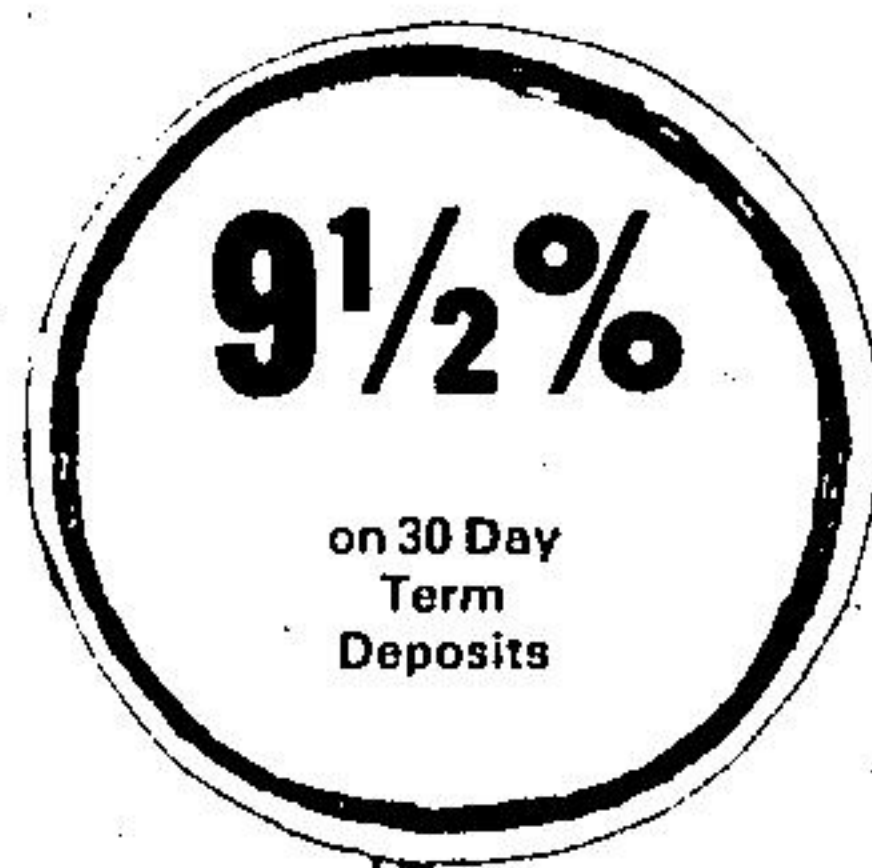
Ladies' bridge champ
