Garden Bros. CIrcus carries on tradition

Garden is a famous Canadian name. For three generations the Garden family has entertained thoughout North America and since 1938, it has been heralded on posters from coast-to-coast advertising Garden Bros. Circus.

Second generation, Ian Garden resides on Travalgar Road. Carrying on in the tradition of his father before him, Garden today takes his show on the road close to 20 weeks a year, largely entertaining audiences in Ontario, Quebec, and northern States. While the circus does not tour as extensively as it did in the old days,

there are new stages for entertainment and he is actively involved in the world of television.

Garden Bros. is a pioneer of the indoor circus business in Canada. After emmigrating from Scotland and a stint in vaudeville, William Garden, Ian's father, presented the first edition of Garden Bros. Circus in 1938 in the C.N.E. Coliseum, under the sponsorship of The Toronto Firefighters. In four years, the circus will observe its 50th Anniversary as the only major Canadian-owned and operated circus.

In their vaudeville days, the senior Gardens were billed as "Garden & Shaw, the Aristocrats of Comedy". William, or "Bill" as he was known everywhere died in 1954 and his widow, Jean is retired and living with family members in Sarasota, Florida.

Garden says that he recruits most of his circus performers in the United States from families who originated and trained in Europe. He is also an entertainer. He has some performing dogs and ponies at his farm and at the moment, he is enjoying training a new horse in dressage. He also acts as ringmaster for the circus. His wife is a professional singer and participates in the big production numbers.

The third generation of the family to entertain is scattered around North America. Ian, Junior is in the United States with an animal act and son, Ricky has joined a flying act in Mexico. A daughter, Jean lives in Tennessee and is the only non-performing member of the family at the present time. Garden's three brothers and a sister also reside in Sarasota where the brothers are successful in the entertainment field but are no longer connected with the circus.

Ian Garden's partner in the circus is B. Elliott Abells. They spend 10 months of the year booking and promoting their entertainment and are responsible for creating and co-ordinating the talent for the program "Circus" on the CTV television network. Today their performing season runs February through May, and July through September, appearing at Ontario Place in Toronto, London Fair, Maple Leaf Gardens, Montreal, and smaller centres which they have visited for many years.

The circus has a long history. It goes back to the days of the Roman Empire. The Grand Entry or parade of the performers and animals around the arena is a reminder of the great processions which escorted the Emperor and his retinue to the Roman circus. Since that time, the circus has been a permanent fixture in many European citles. The circus tent was
