

Nellis Atoms pummel Hornby 12-2

The Nellis Construction Halton Rural Atoms continued their winning ways last week as they destroyed Hornby 12-2, June 18.

The Atoms were also undefeated in their previous three matches as they whitewashed Glen Williams 6-0 and 4-0 and then demolished Limehouse 18-10, June 11.
