

Strike possible at colleges

A Brampton-based negotiator for community college teachers says a strike is possible because the two sides are "diametrically opposed."

"The feeling in the early going is that people see the writing on the wall," said Ron Martin, a negotiator for teachers at Sheridan College's Brampton campus.

The major issue to surface has been the teachers' workload, and Martin says the two sides are far from an agreement.

"We're diametrically opposed. The government wants total flexibility and we want controls," he said.

Contract talks between the 7,000 teachers, who are members of the Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU), and negotiators for the province's 22 community colleges recently reached an impasse. The teachers have requested that a factfinder be

appointed by the province to meet with both union and management negotiating teams to pinpoint the areas of disagreement. The factfinder has yet to be named.

Teachers want compensation for time spent working outside the classroom. Job security is also a major factor for the teachers during the negotiations.

Martin says that as classes become larger, teachers must put in more hours. Eventually, the students suffer.

Calling the situation "horrendous", Martin says the faculty will probably be behind the union if a strike vote is indeed called.

He says the union will not put a "heavy press on money" if it is granted the workload concessions and some sort of job security for the teachers.

The contract settlement must be made by October 17, he adds.
