chief Carl Meadows told council that grass fire season will soon be here. He recalled that one day last year there were nine fires in one day. Mr. Meadows appealed to the township council Monday for their assistance in helping

to prevent the fires. Councillors agreed that better enforcement of the fire by-law would help the firefighters. The by-law reads that anyone setting a fire must have a permit either from the township office or the fire hall. Anyone who has a grass fire without a permit

Councillor Dave Masson embarrassing suggested those with fires through the newspapers. He said that if a person's name is going to be in the paper, with the cause of fire, and how much it cost the taxpayers for the firefighters to battle the flames, the next person would think twice before lighting a fire.






