treatment. I don't want to rob anyone of their cultural and linguistic heritage," he said. Jelinek was nominated by TV personality Bill Walker and the nomination was seconded by Nan Cargill of Acton.

Speaking in support of Tris Lett, YPC President Jamie Watt said his generation had new problems and needed new and different views and solutions.

Lett had the most enthusiastic supporters of the bunch, even if their numbers didn't equal their enthusiasm.

A vibrant cheering section led by his wife Toni paraded around the room chanting "Let's go, Let's win". Lett said the big job ahead of Canada was to get Canadians working again and "restore the pride that Trudeau has done so much to belittle".

Lett referred extensively to the need to rebuild the economy and his personal qualifications in that area. "We have to get rid of the welfare state and restore it with thrift and the lasting value of work."

Doctor Art Ross was nominated by Mel Thorne of Oakville and the nomination

was seconded by Nancy Kees of Milton.

Ross said the UIC should be revamped to protect only those who truly could not find work. "I oppose a government which protects those who can work."

He said the elderly feel cheated by what has happened to their pensions and their country.

He also said the gross overspending of the government would be a millstone around the necks of our children and their children. He rapped the PM for what has happened to the Canadian

dollar and after listing the Trudeau government's downfalls, he said, "he thinks Canadians can't count, that they can't keep score".

Ross ridiculed Trudeau for telling Canadians to tighten their belts after he had bribed them with giveaway programs. "Some of our old aged have already tightened their belts until it hurts."

He said Trudeau will ask Canada to have him negotiate with Quebec over separation. He scoffed at the notion, indicating, "that's like asking the Boston strangler to straighten your tie".

Town hires students from Halton Hills

While most students hired by the works and engineering departments of Halton Hills will come from the town a few won't, engineer Robert Austin told works committee Monday night.

He said all of the students working in the works department will be either local high school or university students. However, some of those working in engineering won't be because local students don't have the proper qualifications.

Deputy engineer Ted Ballinger said engineering students will be paid on a sliding scale based on education and years of experience. Those working in

the works department will be paid a flat rate. The engineering students will be paid more and that has historically been the case, Ballinger explained, because they are older and civil engineering students. They do surveying work and construction inspection as well as working in the office. Because they are engineering students they are very useful to the department, Ballinger concluded.

Hiring engineering students also helps the town because they can work longer than high school students Ballinger said, noting finance-administration committee objects to hiring students who aren't from

Halton Hills. One engineering student being hired for his sixth summer by the town is from Georgetown but the other three aren't local, the committee was told by the engineers.

Austin noted there is no problem hiring local students for works and 15 of the 20 being hired by the two departments are from Halton Hills.

Mayor Tom Hill said if Halton Hills students have the proper qualifications they should receive preference but it is alright to hire students from outside the town.

Committee agreed with the mayor.
