Acton Merchants to play in Georgetown loop

The Georgetown Industrial Football League will expand to 12 teams this season, with the addition of the Acton Merchants, Limehouse, Hornby Juniors, Glen Williams and Harley Motors. Last year's Puckering Flyers team will play this season under the sponsorship of Rexway Towing.

The league had 11 teams last year, DRG Stationery, Niner's Sportoutfitters, Sandhill Shell and Norval are not returning.

Returning from last year's entry list are Peel Regional Police, Fort-a-mix Meta, Robert's Flyers, Royal Trust, Georgetown Chrysler Yankees, and Way-Jay Sportsmen.

The league opens play, Sunday, May 14, when Limehouse plays Fort-a-mix and Royal Trust faces Robert's Flyers at 2. All other teams will play Sunday night, Peel Police vs. Rexway Towing, Glen Williams vs. Georgetown Chrysler at 6.30, followed by Hornby Juniors against Harley Motors and Acton Merchants battling Way-Jay Sportsmen.

There will be four games scheduled for every Sunday night and possibly one or two on various Sunday after-

noons, three games on Monday nights starting at 6.30, two games in Hornby on Tuesday nights at 6.30 and 8.30. There will also be four games at the Georgetown Fairgrounds Wednesday nights, two at 6.30 and two at 8.30.

Acton Merchants will play as many of their games as possible at the Acton Fairgrounds, Thursday nights, with an 8.30 starting time. Some of the Glen Williams home games may be shifted to the Glen ballpark.

There will be no games scheduled on the Sundays of long weekends, but there will be games on the Monday nights of long weekends.

Three teams in the league run tournaments and the executive has agreed not to schedule league games on those dates. Acton Merchants will hold a tournament, June 16-17-18, Harley Motors July 14-15-16 and Glen Williams, August 19-20.

An all-star game has been scheduled into the season for Sunday, July 23 at 7 p.m. It will pit the first and third place all-star teams against the second and fourth teams.

Each team will play 33 games, three each against their 11 opponents, with eight

teams making the playoffs. Bryan Lewis was re-appointed president and secretary at a recent league meeting. Zeke McCandless will be acting as vice-president and treasurer.

The executive has decided to move the deadline for moving back and forth between industrial teams and inter-county teams ahead from June 30 to May 31. By May 31 a player must decide which league he wishes to play in.

No player who performed as a pitcher in the inter-county league last year may pitch in the GIFL this year.
