

Major injuries

A 19-year-old St. Michael St. woman was taken to Guelph General Hospital with major injuries Thursday evening following a two-car collision in Ospringe. Guelph OPP say Theresa Wilson was a passenger in a car driven by Mark Goodlet, 22, of the same address, when the vehicle collided with another driven by a 72-year-old Waterloo woman. The second driver received minor injuries. Damages were set at \$8,000 to the two cars following the collision at the intersection of Highways 24 and 25. As of press time, Guelph General could not provide additional information about Wilson's condition.

Boy hit by car

A nine-year-old boy received minor injuries when he was hit by a car while on his bicycle. The driver of the car, a 23year-old Sunnyside Drive, Erin resident told police the bicycle was in the middle of the road at the top of the hill on 7th Line and her car was unable to swerve to avoid the youngster.



Major injuries
