Just as you are never quite sure where you're at with such a dame, you are never sure of what a Canadian summer has in store for you.

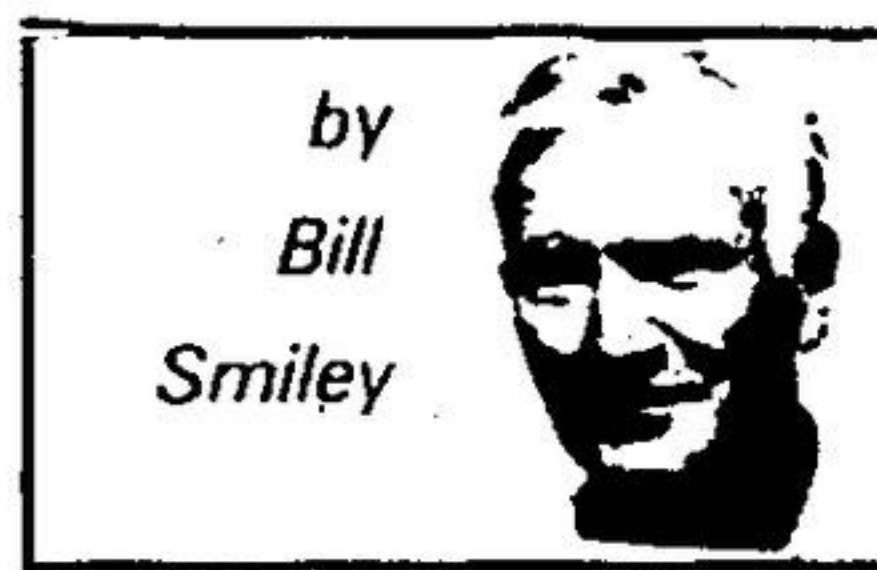
She might greet you with the warm, seductive scents of June and, just as you are about to seize her, retreat into a frame
